This is a feel good exercise that achieves very little long term results. Real change can only be achieved by central government action, such as requiring manufactures to be responsible for the recovery of their products e.g. white-ware, electronics, and other large items at there end of life. Also banning the use of unnecessary plastic packaging and requiring properly locally biodegradable packaging instead. Further action such as returnable deposits on glass bottles and mandated reuse of the recovered products, law requiring items to be modular and repairable rather than sealed for life and disposable.

The usage indicted does not justify the expenditure, especially in the current cost of living crisis. I expect based on the numbers and age groups (babies and senior community members), as well as the activities described, the Olympic pool is not fit for purpose. Rural schools have swimming pools for their lessons, and I expect would not conduct lessons all year round, therefore would not significantly increase attendance. In addition, many families use the Ohakea, Feilding and multiple Palmerston North pools, as this fits better with their work and life locations. This option is not essential in the midst of a cost of living crisis.

Comments about Kerbside Collection:

Why would we have to pay extra in our rates for a service that is mostly already free. If this is rolled out, are we expected to pay for the current expense plus the addition of collection. According to your website there are refuse stations in Bulls, Hunterville, Mangaweka, Marton, Rātana and Taihape. These are not big geographical towns, and the extra cost proposed for this service to replace the 1-5 min drive is not justified in a cost of living crisis. In addition, how much food scraps are you anticipating? Homes with disposals reduce significantly the quantity of food scraps that go into waste. Also if you are only collecting a 'standardised' set of recyclables, do the remainder go into landfill or am I still expected to take it to the local refuse station.

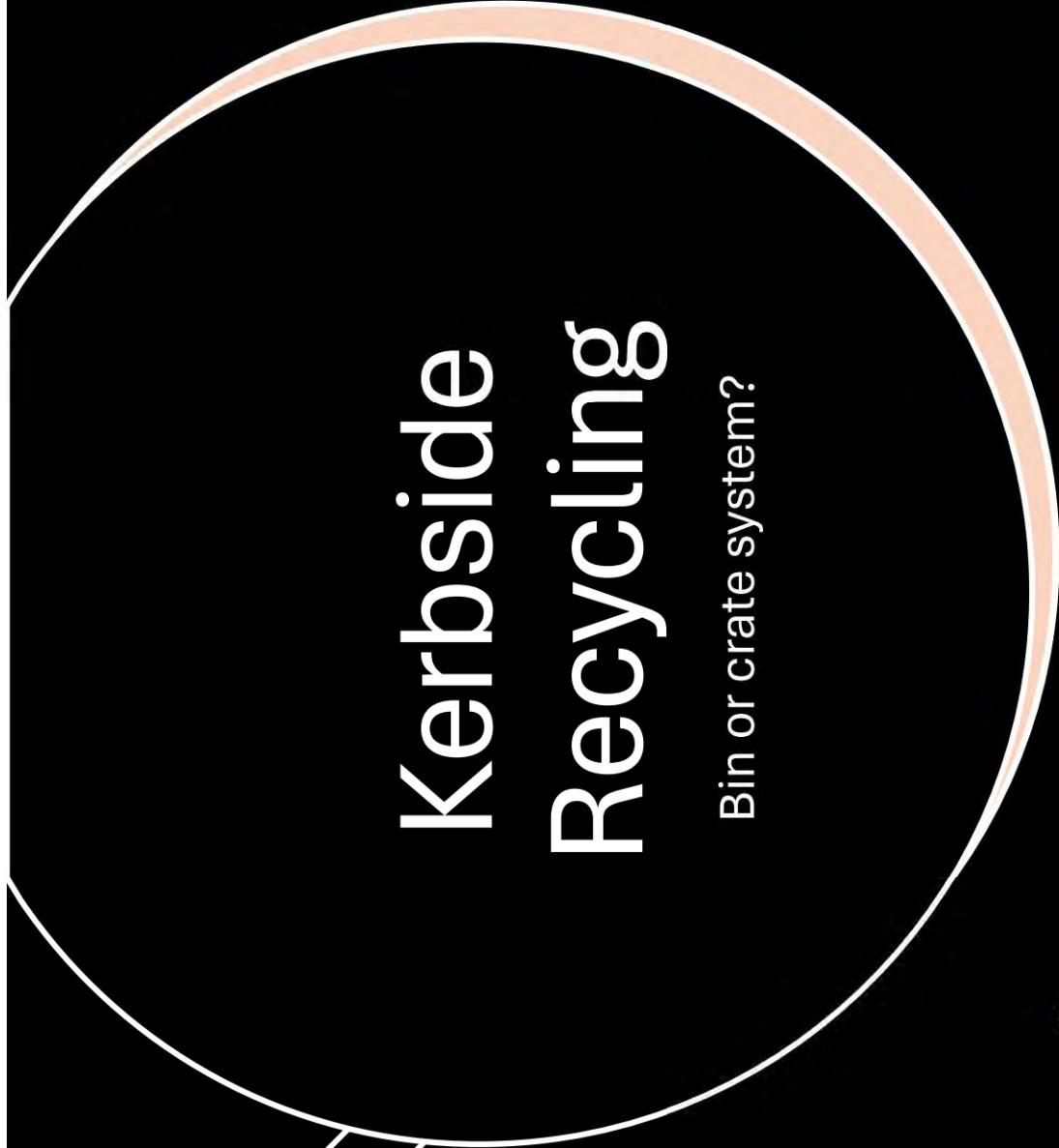

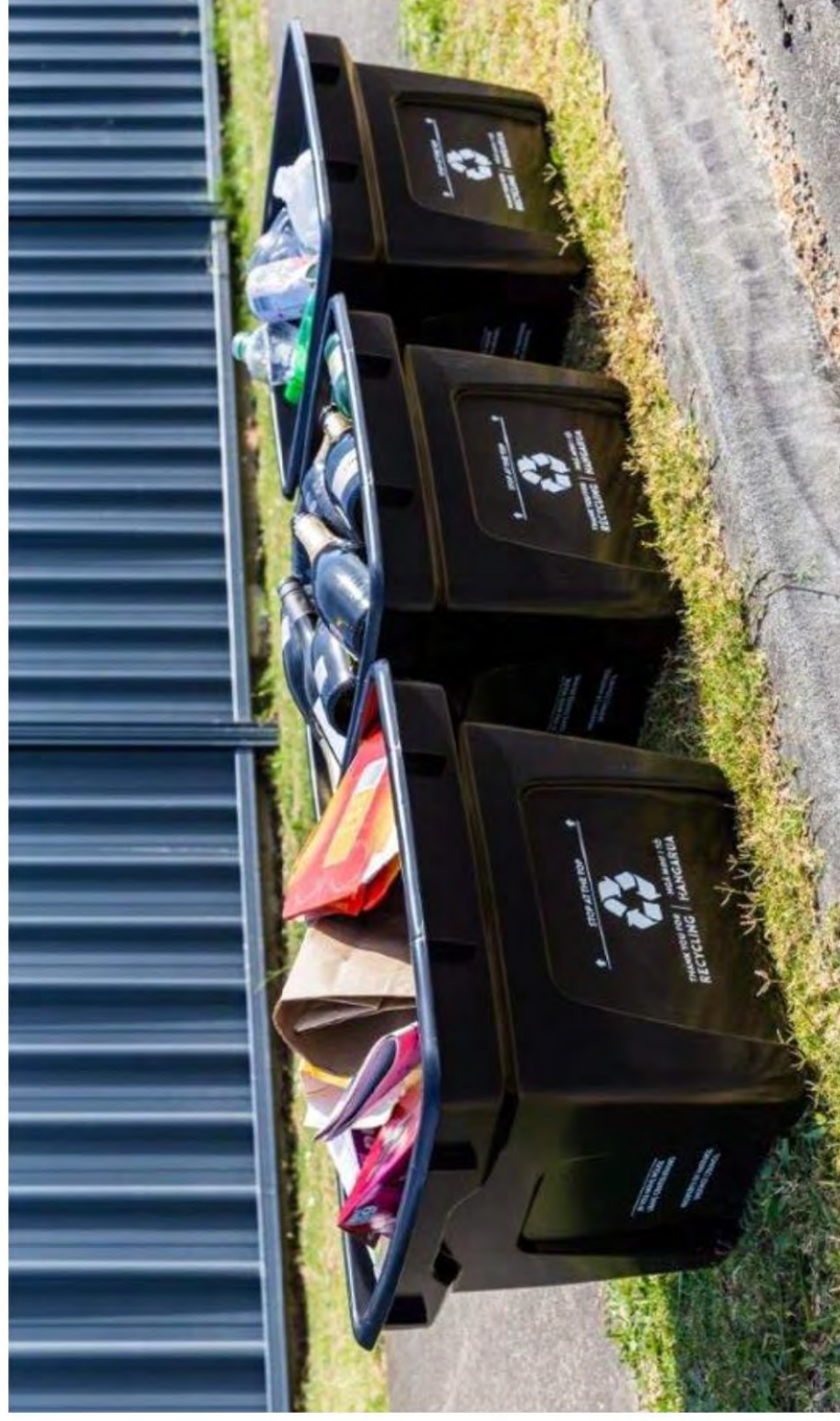

RE: Rangitikei District Council's 2024 – 2034 Long Term Plan.

KPA Properties are a well-established property development company. As a team we have identified and developed over 100 sections and new homes across the region. We're a strong group with several industry contributing businesses, employing over 60 staff, and endless contractors & consultants.

In 2020, KPA identified and purchased a pocket of land in Bulls, perfect for development. We were excited and passionate about this project, and the awesome community of Bulls; however, as this process has now been 4 years in the making and has been faced with significant challenges, our excitement is fading.

One example of the challenges we have faced is that KPA were proposing to incorporate neighbouring Council owned land, Haylock Park into the development. This was by bringing Walker Crescent through to connect to the new subdivision, as well as adding a playground to the park, and introducing small community-based businesses. This park currently sits in the heart of Bulls as nothing more than a paddock for sheep to graze. Our proposal appeared to encompass that of RDC's LTP; "Our goal is to ensure our infrastructure, relationships and regulatory framework support the ongoing development of high-quality built environments and improvement in the natural environment". However, unfortunately after causing a 12-month delay to our project, RDC took this option off the table and we were forced to push on with our development without the consideration of Haylock Park. This proposal appeared to be largely disregarded and was in the "too hard basket" for Council, which was incredibly disappointing as we had put a lot of thought and resources into this idea and were passionate about the initiative being a positive one for the Bulls Community. We believe this is worth reconsidering.

Another example of a significant delay to this project is the rezoning of a portion of our land which is currently zoned rural. RDC approached us towards the end of 2022 (approximately 18 months ago), to notify us that our land had been identified as suitable for residential development under RDC's urban plan change. However, after little communication, we recently asked about the progression of this, and were told that RDC won't be able to say if the land is to be rezoned under this plan until towards the end of 2024. This process is then likely to take some time, so we could be another 2-3 years from beginning this portion of the project due to Council hold ups.

Following budget hinderances, we are now reassessing the viability of the project and identifying areas that can be redesigned in order to bring civil costs down. This has been a discussion with RDC for 7 months to date; however, we have been very disappointed with RDC's processes in dealing with this. There doesn't appear to be any room for compromise, or a willingness to work with us in order to form a mutually beneficial result.

KPA's Director's have also been faced with numerous other issues within the RDC district that have not been pleasant experiences, on both commercial and residential sites.

We would like to make point of our long-lasting relationships with Manawatu District Council and Palmerston North City Council, where our initiatives are not only supported but encouraged. The processes at both of these Councils are very inclusive and revolves around open discussions, problem solving and compromise.

With reference to RDC's LTP - Mayor's Message "One of the ways Council can look to ease this rate burden is to continue to focus on economic growth. In simple terms the more people and businesses that we have spreads the financial load on rates." Bulls needs properties to be developed in order to support sustainable economic growth.

In the time that we have owned our development in Bulls, we have purchased, developed, and sold 18 other houses, and have invested in a further 14 – all of which are due to be completed in the next 16 months (prior to us being able to build a single house in Bulls). These are resources that we intended to be putting in Bulls but have instead had to redirect our focus to Council's that we felt our investments would be secure within, during this unstable and uncertain time in the housing market.

In summary, KPA Properties are currently sitting on a piece of land that offers upwards of 125 new residential sections and partially due to a general lack of flexibility and slow processes from Council, we have been unable to push on with this project for 4 years (and expected to be at least another 1 year before we are able to dig any dirt).

Again, quoting RDC's LTP – Growth "We are continuing to grow, and we need to make sure we are in a position for that to happen. Over the next 10 years we are expecting an increase of 1,350 more people calling Rangitikei home." Population growth is impossible to achieve without new homes. If RDC intends to grow its population, it needs to support the development and housing industry, and work with the likes of KPA to achieve these goals.



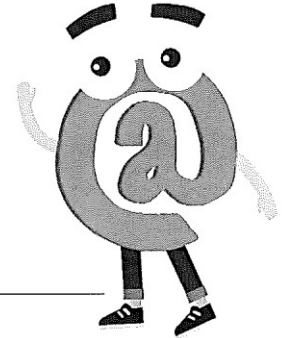
