District Plan - Urban Harmony

The District Plan is the blueprint for growth and land development for the district. The last District Plan was adopted more than 10 years ago, and council are now reviewing the plan.

The Plan ensures that there is harmony between the different development zones such as rural, industrial, and residential.

The plan review will take part in sections, and the first section to be reviewed is Proposed Plan Change 3: Urban Growth, which will focus on Marton, Bulls and Taihape, as well as any villages that have a residential or rural living zone.

The three main things that the proposed plan change will look at are:

- How to better provide for the intensification of urban areas where appropriate
- Whether the District Plan's Residential and Rural Living provisions are working well and if not, what needs to change and why.
- Rezoning land from Rural to Residential to provide for greenfield development where there is an identified need.

We'll soon be seeking informal feedback, which will then be used by our planning team to finalise the draft proposal ahead of the formal consultation phase which is required by law.

2025 is a Local Election year

This means our communications might look a little different from now as we move into the election period.

Are you enrolled to vote? Now is a great time to ensure you are enrolled and your details are up-to-date. You can do this by following the QR code at the bottom of this issue of the Connect.

Soon we will start sharing information about what our Elected Members do, how local democracy shapes our Rangitīkei, and why you might be interested in standing this year.

Our goal is to buck the national trend of declining voter turnout in local elections and increase the amount of people voting in Rangitīkei. Nationally, only 41 percent of eligible voters took part in the last elections in 2022 (Rangitīkei achieved 46 percent).

A reminder to everyone that Council's communications channels cannot be used for electioneering purposes. Any posts or comments from people discussing their own, or someone else's nomination, or intention to run for council, will be removed.

Local democracy is central to making our Rangitīkei home. Having your say on who serves you and advocates for your voice at the decision-making table is incredibly important.

Annual Plan & Co consultation closing

You have until 5pm on Monday, 5 May to submit your feedback on 'Where's Annual Plan & Co @ Rangitīkei? We're seeking your input on Council's budget and work programme for the 2025/26 financial year.

Council aren't making any significant changes to the plan, we're just getting on with the things that we said we would do, and reducing costs where we have been able to identify savings. But the reality is that the cost of providing our services and funding the projects we're prioritising has increased. As the old saying goes, nothing is as cheap to do as it is now.

For us to carry on executing the plan that we have in place for the 2025/26 financial year, we need to increase the overall bucket of money to cover the costs by 9.1 percent (down from 9.9 percent proposed in the Long-term Plan last year). This means we are proposing an average rates increase across the district of 9.1%. You can find out more about what this means for your property by following the link below.
