community committee structure. We are still yet to work out how this structure will look and when it will be fully established, but rest assured it will be one of the first priorities.



There are a number of projects that will be front of mind for the new council – Local Water Done Well and our relationship with Palmerston North and Horowhenua councils undoubtedly top that list but we also have the new buildings that are programmed - understanding where these fit, within the earthquake prone legislation will be important.

The new councillors will take some time to come up to speed and that's understandable but feel free to approach them and as always my door is open at any time.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTION 2025

The Preliminary Results for the Rangitikei Local Elections 2025 are in, and incumbent Mayor Andy Watson has been returned for a fifth term.

Of the enrolled voters in the district, 49.11 percent voted (not including special votes), which is an increase on the 46 percent received in the 2022 elections. There are seven returning elected members, including Mayor Andy. The others are:
