column. My thanks go to the Taihape residents for being careful around their use. We have completed hearing submissions to and deliberations on the Annual Plan. The

projected rate increase was 7.29% which is an average property increase of 6.29%. We are yet to formally adopt our rate increases but they will be slightly in excess of that as Council desires to fund some community works including supporting Hunterville, Koitiata and a district housing survey.

A fortnight ago there was an art exhibition at Te Matapihi featuring local artists in collaboration with Square Edge in Palmerston North. Unfortunately I was not aware that there was to be a formal opening on the Friday evening. I am disappointed I was unable to front this and I have apologised to a number of parties around our non-attendance. I am also now making a public apology for this. We hope to work more closely with Square Edge and our artists in the future for a possible annual showcasing event.

The 5th of June saw the celebration of Samoan Independence Day at Memorial Hall in Marton. As always our churches were all present with huge numbers for a wonderful service. On a sad note it would seem as though Rev. Farani Vaa will be likely given another overseas posting so we will probably be farewelling him from our district soon. I would like to thank Farani for the huge amount of service that he has given to our district and his involvement in a number of community events over the years.

Local elections will be held through August/September and a new council will be established in October. I encourage people to stand for these positions. # Taihape residents urged to continue conserving water.

Recent heavy rainfall has created pressure on the Taihape water treatment plant. Significant rainfall creates dirty water in the Hautapu river; this river water is the source of Taihape's drinking water. When it is dirty for long periods, treatment is more difficult and takes longer than usual. This means the output of clean water into the reservoir is slower than normal. During this time, water is being used faster than it is being treated and is causing the reservoir levels to drop.

Process improvement upgrades require a temporary shutdown of the plant and can only take place once the reservoir is sufficiently full - we are aiming for this to be 100%. In order to resolve the issue, we are relying on the community conserving water

so the reservoir levels can increase. The reservoir is currently making slow gains and we thank the public for their ongoing cooperation.

Treatment staff have been working 24/7 to manage the issue and, when necessary, drinking water is being transported from Mangaweka to the Taihape reservoir.

The water is currently being treated to a high standard and should this change the public will be notified.

## Security guards to monitor incorrect use of Bulls Bus Lane

Council is aware of cars and heavy vehicles incorrectly using the Bulls Bus Lane, including disregard of the 10kmh speed limit. Security guards will now be monitoring the bus lane to inform breaching motorists.







No vehicles other than buses should be passing through the new Bulls Bus Lane. Other vehicles using this lane can create safety hazards for bus users and the public. Bus only signage and markings are displayed at the entrance and throughout to highlight the bus only area. Public safety is our number one priority. The bus lane has not been designed as a thoroughfare for trucks or light vehicles. We ask that drivers respect patron safety and use public roads for travel.
