Tena koutou katoa, as always we have had a number of events in our district recently.

The Cowpers hosted their annual 4x4 event last weekend in Turakina which was incredibly successful and this follows the equally successful Harvest Festival in March and ANZAC Day commemorations across the district in April. A common

feature with our events this year has been the worry of rain. This has been the wettest year that I can remember for a very, very long time. While we tend to reflect on leisure and entertainment pursuits let's spare a thought for a second around our farming community. A number of our crops such as maize, wheat and barley have had a challenging season. There have been a huge number of submissions to our Annual Plan and Spatial Plan process. On some of the key choices we seem to have very clear direction on how we move forward. Deliberations, or decision making, will occur on 1 June so that we have the annual plan finalised by the end of the financial year June/July.

Community Spatial Plan. 268 written submissions were received for the 2023/24 Annual Plan and 180 written submissions for the Community Spatial Plan. The feedback provided in the submissions plays a key part in assisting us with our decision making moving forward. It is fantastic to see such a positive response.

Public hearings held in Taihape and Marton on the 11-12 May gave opportunity for those submitters who wished to speak to present verbally. Over the two days 45 people addressed Council on the Annual Plan and Spatial Plan. Speakers were given ten minutes for each submission to present, and to answer questions from Elected Members. All submissions and feedback on the Annual Plan will be considered by Council on 1 June and any changes made will be incorporated into the updated 2023/24 Annual Plan work is ongoing on the Community Spatial Plan.

Thank you to all who took the time to send submissions and those who presented, your input and voice is an important part of us shaping the future of our district.

# We're Building Our Way to Better Water Our Current Water - Sound But Not Great The water we use from the Totaenai reservoir is affected by algae blooms and other external influences (weather, animals, etc). Although this water is treated and completely safe to drink, we know that it doesn't always taste or smell the best. A New Plant For Better Filtration Our current plant is 100 years old. We're planning major upgrades so it can cope with the different water and produce more consistent drinking water for you.

We're developing a test bore right now to identify an aquifer that might be able to provide more steady and higher quality water for us to use.

Backup Water for High Demand
The water we get from this bore and the Tottaenub fore is sound, but we need more to meet our growing population's needs.
Sourcing water from multiple places also makes us better prepared for emergencies.

Better Water for A Better Future
It takes time for these changes, happening in the background, to result in great drinking water. But by the end of 2024, you will see the results flowing through your taps.

We know the drinking water in Marton isn't great, and we're working on a solution.

Our plans include:

- Identifying a more reliable and steady water source
- Finding more water to cater for our population growth
- Upgrading our 100-year-old water treatment plant for better filtration
