FROM THE Mayor'S DESK

Talofa lava, this week is Samoan Language week, I would like to greatly acknowledge the Samoan community we have in our District.

I, like all of the Councillors, have just received the collated copy of submissions for the Annual Plan along with officer comments. Council will be using these as part of what we call

deliberations, or in simple terms, deciding on whether we agree with the submissions and what we can and cannot support. Deliberations will be held on Thursday 1 June and will probably take all day. I suspect that Councillors may well ask for further information from officers before reaching a final position on a number of the requests. Councillors will also be keen to get updated positions on the costs around some of the major infrastructural programmes to have some idea as to whether they are affordable against our financial position.

Clean-up from the flood event last weekend seems to have gone reasonably smoothly. We are working on assessing costs of the damage done to our roading network. Damage comes on top of damage already caused by Cyclone Gabrielle where we are informed there are 45 dropouts on rural roads that need to be repaired. The process for these things is one of an agreed budget with Waka Kotahi and also discussions with roading contractors as to literally who is available to do this work. With the amount of damage in the North Island over recent times, all of the contractors are incredibly busy so it may well be a case of waiting for our turn.

Last week we welcomed four new citizens to the Rangitīkei district. They featured people from Samoa, Ireland and India. We originally had a larger group apply but because of illness or commitments elsewhere they were not all able to attend this time. One of the nice thing about having a smaller ceremony is that you actually get time to spend with the people and understand why they've come to New Zealand and what they're currently doing - and just being able to personally welcome them here. For some larger ceremonies it becomes a process rather than a personal touch.

We have several capital projects that are coming to fruition and we are making plans that will change how our communities look in future years.

"Over the coming months, Council will look to appoint an interim Chief Executive to take over from Peter while a recruitment process is underway. We will keep the community informed about this as it happens."
