The idea of the rail hub has been more than three years in the making and I am thrilled the Government has recognised the opportunity this brings to us. Not only does this recognise the importance of funding key infrastructure in our small towns, but it will also provide jobs in our local community."

Council will go through a resource consent process once the District Plan change has been completed, a decision on that change is imminent.

If you don't have the app, get it now, and start using it immediately. The NZ COVID Tracer app is available free at the App Store and Google Play.


