Decision made on two major projects

The final Council meeting of 2023 saw decisions made on two big projects in the District. One of these options was the Broadway/High Street corner block in Marton, which has

been discounted due to the rising costs of redevelopment and the complexity of the site.

Discussions on options for the corner block property will happen next year.

The build at High Street will be a progressive project which means staff will not have to move offsite while it is being constructed. This is a great option with little disruption, and the ability to maintain business as usual.

Mayor Andy said "the option to remain on the High Street site means our community can be assured we will meet costs within the existing budget that we have in our Long Term Plan. Staff are excited to finally know they will get a building fit for purpose and happy to work out of."

The second important decision made was for the Taihape Town Hall / Civic Centre.

This Landmark building has been closed to the public since 2021 as it was identified as an earthquake-prone building, posing a significant risk to life in the event of an earthquake. It's hosted a number of events over the years from concerts and theatre productions to sports and recreation, to important community meetings and business events, and everything else in between. It also houses the Taihape Library, Information Centre, and administration offices.

Council has agreed to start the process to strengthen and upgrade the existing Taihape town hall /civic centre. This follows the request of the Taihape community.

Mayor Andy said "like our build in Marton this project will be done within the current Long Term Plan budget. It will be nice to see the icon of Taihape open and made fit for purpose."

It is an exciting time and we will keep the public updated on the progress of these two projects.
