## FROM THE Mayor'S DESK

Kia ora koutou, on 17 February I attended the opening of the new Taihape Hato Hone St John Ambulance Station. The new centre provides fantastic facilities for the 24 hour two-man station covering a lot of State Highway 1 and all of the Taihape community from Ohingaiti to nearly Turangi. The need for a new centre was identified many many years ago and for the last six



or seven years, that I know of, the community has been raising money and preparing the arguments for Government and St John funding. Well the great news is that day arrived on Saturday, there was a huge turnout of St John staff both locally and nationally. I would like to acknowledge Sandy Rowland from Taihape St John – this has been her mission and she was the one who drove the fundraising as part of the Taihape Area Committee. Sandy, myself and the community thank you, you absolutely deserve this new centre.

At the opening there were a large number of sponsors acknowledged including Motukawa and Rimanui Stations, the duck race organised by Matt Hobbs and supported by the community together with funding raised by the Taihape Motorcycle Club with their fun runs over the last couple of years. Harry Lazarus was the driver for the motorcycle fundraising events and the Motorcycle Club was presented with a plaque recognising their efforts by St John nationally at the opening.

I have highlighted how our various communities get behind new facilities in the district on a number of occasions and whether it's Hunterville, Taihape, Marton or Bulls each community has these publicly spirited people willing to volunteer their time and get in behind these fantastic projects. What is incredibly disappointing is that the efforts in Marton by the Tutaenui Restoration Society at the B and C Dams, which accounts for tens of thousands of hours of public work, have been marred recently by graffiti. For those people in our community who did the graffiti I would welcome the chance to have a discussion with you around how much work was put in to make these facilities what they are and if there is any way that I can work with you to clean up the mess you have left behind.

There are a couple of major Council events happening at the moment – first is the by-election to get a new Southern Ward Councillor. We have received nominations from four people for that vacancy and no doubt they will be out in the community looking to raise their profiles over the next few weeks with the final date for the election process being 12 April.

The other event is the Long Term Plan 2024-2034 (LTP), Council is looking to adopt the LTP this month so March will be dominated by in excess of 20 public meetings to discuss the implications of what Council intends to do, how it will be funded and also be able to talk about how we fit in with Government's position. We will put out a list of consultation meetings over the next few weeks and I would urge you to attend one of these public meetings or at the very least if you want to discuss certain subjects please don't hesitate to contact me. **Ngā mihi, Andy Watson, Mayor of Rangitīkei.**
