Subject: Consideration of Applications for the Event Sponsorship Scheme 2019-2020 – Round Two

1 Background

- 1.1 The 2019/20 budget for the Event Sponsorship Scheme (ESS) is **\$25,000**. There are two funding rounds held in August 2019 and March 2020. It is suggested that the Committee allocated a maximum of 75% of the total amount (\$18,750) to ensure there was money left for round two.
- 1.2 A total of \$16,379 was awarded in Round One, leaving \$8,621 to allocate to applicants in Round 2.
- 1.3 A total of \$22,439 has been requested in Round Two, which is \$13,818 more than the \$8,621 available.
- 1.4 The criteria for the ESS states that grants can only be made to a maximum of 50% of eligible costs. It is suggested that the Committee give consideration to the project's likelihood of success if funded for less than the amount requested. Partially funding a project which then fails through an inability to attract other funding impacts negatively on the project in question. This approach would mirror that which Creative New Zealand strongly advocates in considering applications for its grant schemes.
- 1.5 This report provides a summary of the applications that have been received and provides information on the expected numbers of attendees and the eligible costs for each application.

2 Overview of applications for sponsorship

- 2.1 The Community Grants sub-committee are asked to individually assess the five applications, listed below, via Smarty Grants and provide a financial recommendation to staff on Monday 13 April 2020 to be available for the deliberation meeting on Wednesday April 15 2020. The financial recommendations will be made available to members of the sub-committee at the meeting.
 - Global Partnership and Development – *Ineligible does not meet applicant criteria*

- Sport Whanganui
- South Makirikiri School
- Project Marton Incorporated
- The Taihape Squash Rackets Club Incorporated
- Bulls Junior Rugby

3 **Analysis for assessment of other criteria**

- 3.1 The table attached as **Appendix 1** collates the information provided by applicants with respect to the number of visitors who will attend the events. These figures imply that the Council has potential to reach up to 4480 attendees from these events (or \$1.92 per attendee based on \$8,621 being available and all events supported).
- 3.2 The table attached as **Appendix 2** collates information identifying the following criteria
- One off event
 - New Event that will become an established event
 - An event that is becoming established
 - High Profile Event
 - Community Event
 - High Profile Community Event
- 3.3 Council has previously factored the following considerations
- Whether the event has a high profile (for visitors or for residents) that Council needs to be seen to be associated with it.
 - Whether the event has the potential to have such a high profile (for visitors or for residents) and sponsorship is required to enable it to establish and/or grow.
- 3.4 Council will also need to determine whether the proposed events will be able to be held if restrictions for public assembly continue beyond 23 April 2020 (the initial proposed end date for the current level 4 alert). At its meeting on 24 March 2020, Council resolved that funds would only be paid for those events which went ahead.¹

4 **Eligible costs associated with the events**

- 4.1 The table overleaf provides information the eligible costs for each event and, subsequently the maximum sponsorship that can be awarded (50% of eligible costs).

- 4.2 All of the events are eligible as they all take place in the Rangitikei. Global Partnership and Development Ltd is ineligible due to not meeting the applicant criteria, as the applicant does not fall under Incorporated Society, Trust or Association, Unincorporated Community Group or Umbrella Organisation.

Race Distances

All age groups will complete the same course. This is approximately 1.5km.

Teams Race

Each school can enter a maximum **two representative teams** in each age category. Teams must be made up of two boys and two girls, from either of the two year groups listed for each event.

Entry Fee

The cost to enter The **Rangitikei Tough Kid®** will be \$3 per participant. Schools will be invoiced the week prior to the event for the amount of kids entered at registration close off on Friday 6th September. **Invoices will not be amended** if kids don't come along on the day that have been registered, however you are able to bring someone along in their place. Please ensure you notify staff when signing in about any changes as it will all need to be changed through the electronic timing system.

Prizes

First, Second and Third place getters in each race will receive a Rosette which will be awarded at the event prize giving (at the conclusion of the event - approximately 1:20pm). Every participant in The **Rangitikei Tough Kid®** will also receive a Participation Certificate which will also be on our Sport Whanganui website for schools to print off (more information about this will be sent out to schools prior to the event).

Sport Whanganui Toughest School

There will be an overall Toughest School Trophy, which will be awarded to the best performing school at The **Rangitikei Tough Kid®**. This will be based on a points system awarded on finishing places from participants in the individual races only (team races don't contribute to the overall Toughest School points). This system is worked out via our electronic timing team, and is made fair for all schools.

Electronic Timing System

The Timing Team will be on site for the 2019 **Rangitikei Tough Kid®** to carry out electronic timing of all individual races. Having an electronic timing team allows us to start kids in waves, and

makes the event safer for all involved.

Course Marshals - EACH SCHOOL TO PROVIDE TWO VOLUNTEERS

Each school that enters The **Rangitikei Tough Kid®** is required to bring along two volunteers on the day to help marshal the event. **Course Marshals must please report to the Sport Whanganui tent at 10:10am for the Volunteer Briefing.**

School sign in on event day

Upon arrival at McIntyre Reserve we ask each school to send the TIC down to the Sport Whanganui tent to pick up their school race pack. This will include all of the race bibs for the kids as well as participation certificates and the days race schedule. If you have any entry changes or issues please bring this up with the Sport Whanganui staff when you sign in. Please note your school will be invoiced for the total amount entered prior to entries closing on Monday 2nd September.

Race Clothing

It is recommended that kids wear t-shirt and shorts or clothes suitable for physical activity. As there is water and mud on the course it is recommended that long pants are not worn as these may weigh children down and become dangerous. Shoes are optional but recommended and bare feet will be at the risk of the individual (please note there are quite a few rocks and sharp objects on the ground at the McIntyre Reserve). We strongly encourage participants to bring a spare change of clothes with them, as they will get wet from their race.

Food & Drink

Food will be available for purchase at the event with South Makirikiri School organising BBQ food to be on sale on site. Please inform kids to bring cash along with them if they wish to buy their lunch. It is a good idea for each child to bring a water bottle with them, as they will be thirsty after completing their race! Please note this is a water only event so only water will be available on site.

Sun Smart

Please ensure your kids have appropriate sun hats and are protected with sun block.

First Aid

Event Safety Medics will be on site during the event, to tend to any injuries or accidents sustained on The **Rangitikei Tough Kid®** course. If at any stage participants are being assessed by Event Safety Medics, an announcement will go over the speaker to ask for the Teacher in Charge to report to the Medic Site. Please be aware of this on the day.

Teacher/Parent Race

To end The **Rangitikei Tough Kid®** there will be a teacher/parent race at 1pm. This is a great chance for spectators to have a go at the Tough Kid® course, and see how tough it really is! We encourage teachers and parents to get dressed up for this occasion. Please note you must be 13 years or older to compete in this race. Those wishing to compete will be required to register and sign a waiver form at the Sport Whanganui tent.
