Sport Whanganui – Rangitikei Tough Kid

The Committee were all in favour of the event, noting most schools in the district are involved in the event.

South Makirikiri School – Santoft Forest and Beach Half Marathon

The Committee were divided in their assessments, acknowledging it promotes the district. It was noted that the event was fundraising and is more of a commercial scale event, making a profit.

Project Marton Incorporated – Crafts Alive 2020

The Committee were in support of the event, however they queried the high advertising costs and the need for an event planner at the cost of \$3,000, when previously the event had been run by volunteers.

The Taihape Squash Rackets Club Incorporated - Taihape Open Tournament

The Committee was supportive of the event, noting how the family friendly club do their best to bring in as many new members from the community.

Bulls Junior Rugby – BJR 10-a-side Tournament

The Committee were all in favour of this event, noting it is great family day out that hosts people from around the district and further afield.

The overall financial decisions were made either by an average of each assessors recommendation or the maximum of 50% of eligible costs.

1 Background

- 1.1 The 2020/21 budget for the Event Sponsorship Scheme (ESS) is **\$25,000**. There are two funding rounds held in August 2020 and March 2021. It is suggested that the Committee allocate a maximum of 75% of the total amount (\$18,750) to ensure there is money left for round two.
- 1.2 A total of \$50,741 has been requested in Round One, which is \$31,991 more than the \$18,750 available.
- 1.3 The criteria for the Events Sponsorship Scheme states that grants can only be made to a maximum of 50% of eligible costs. It is suggested that the Committee give consideration to the project's likelihood of success if funded for less than the amount requested. Partially funding a project which then fails through an inability to attract other funding impacts negatively on the project in question. This approach would mirror that which Creative New Zealand strongly advocates in considering applications for its grant schemes.
- 1.4 At its 30 July 2020 meeting, Council agreed to amend the Events Sponsorship Scheme Costs Covered to include Equipment Hire.
- 1.5 Council also agreed to amend the Exclusions to include Events solely run for commercial or fundraising purposes.
- 1.6 This report provides a summary of the applications that have been received for Round One, and provides information on the expected numbers of attendees and the eligible costs for each application.

2 Overview of applications for sponsorship

- 2.1 The Community Grants Sub-Committee are asked to individually assess and provide a financial recommendation on the eleven applications, listed below, via the online Smarty Grants portal. This needs to be completed no later than Sunday 27 September 2020 to be available for the deliberation meeting on Tuesday 29 September 2020. The

financial recommendations will be made available to members of the Sub-Committee at the meeting.

3 Analysis for assessment of other criteria

3.1 The table attached as **Appendix 1** collates the information provided by applicants with respect to the number of visitors who will attend the events. These figures imply that the Council has potential to reach up to 20,275 attendees from these events (or \$0.92 per attendee based on \$18,750 being available and all events supported).

3.2 The table attached as **Appendix 2** collates information identifying the following criteria

- One off event
- New Event that will become an established event
- An event that is becoming established
- An established, regular event
- High Profile Event
- Community Event
- High Profile Community Event

3.3 Council has previously factored the following considerations

- Whether the event has a high profile (for visitors or for residents) that Council needs to be seen to be associated with it.
- Whether the event has the potential to have such a high profile (for visitors or for residents) and sponsorship is required to enable it to establish and/or grow.

4 Eligible costs associated with the events

4.1 The table overleaf provides information the eligible costs for each event and, subsequently the maximum sponsorship that can be awarded (50% of eligible costs).

What worked really well: *

We had three new sponsors for our parade as well as retaining our existing sponsorship base.

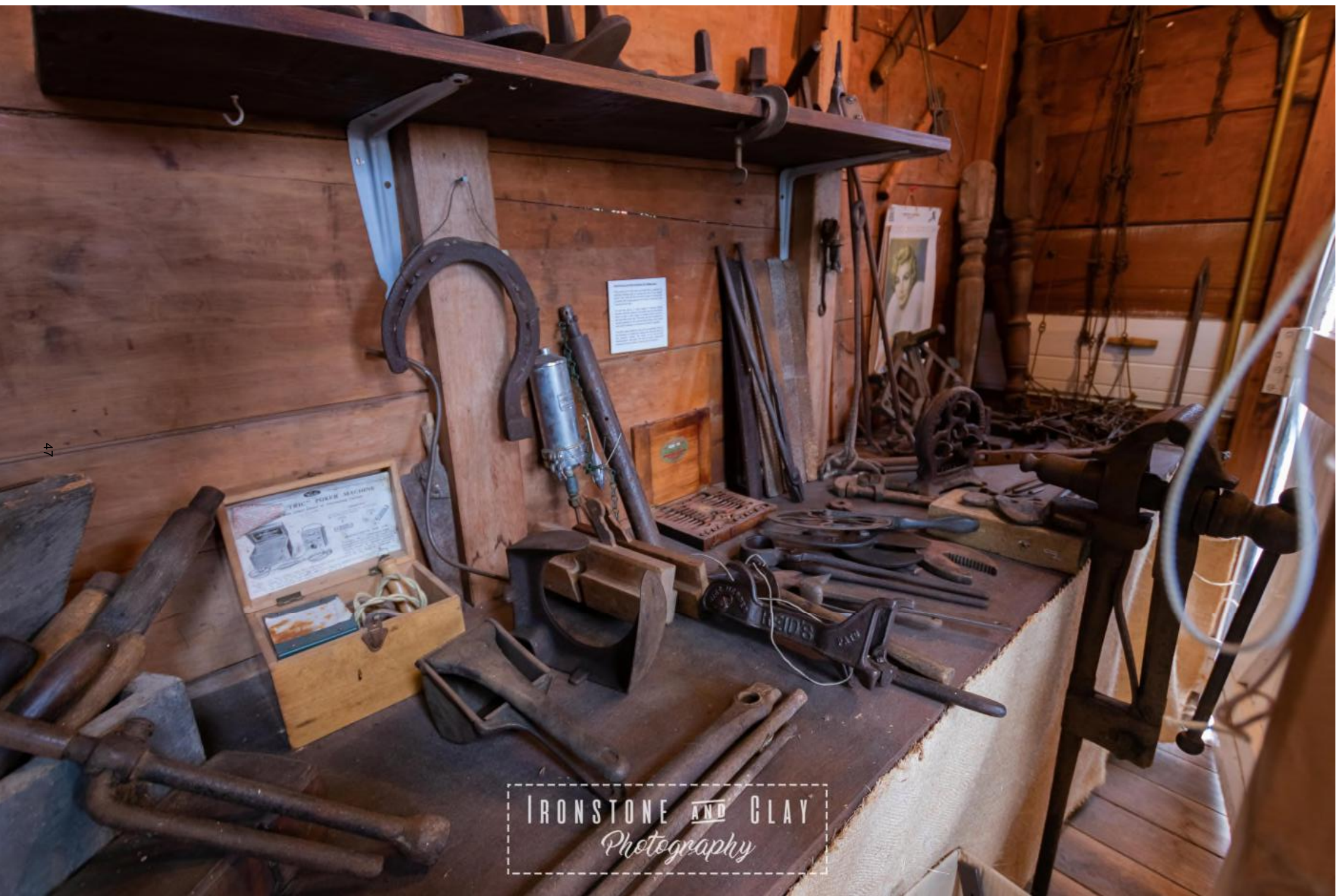

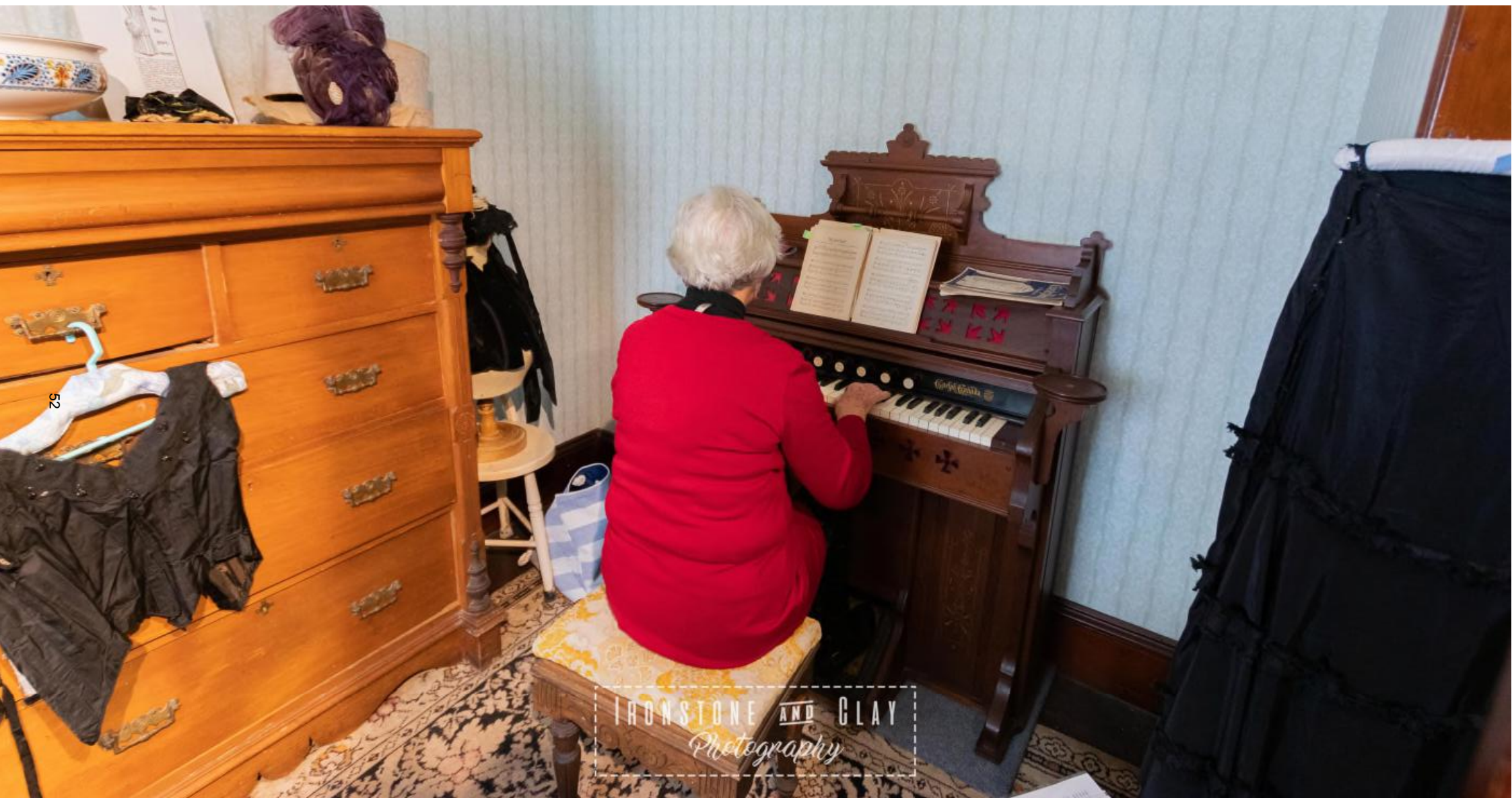

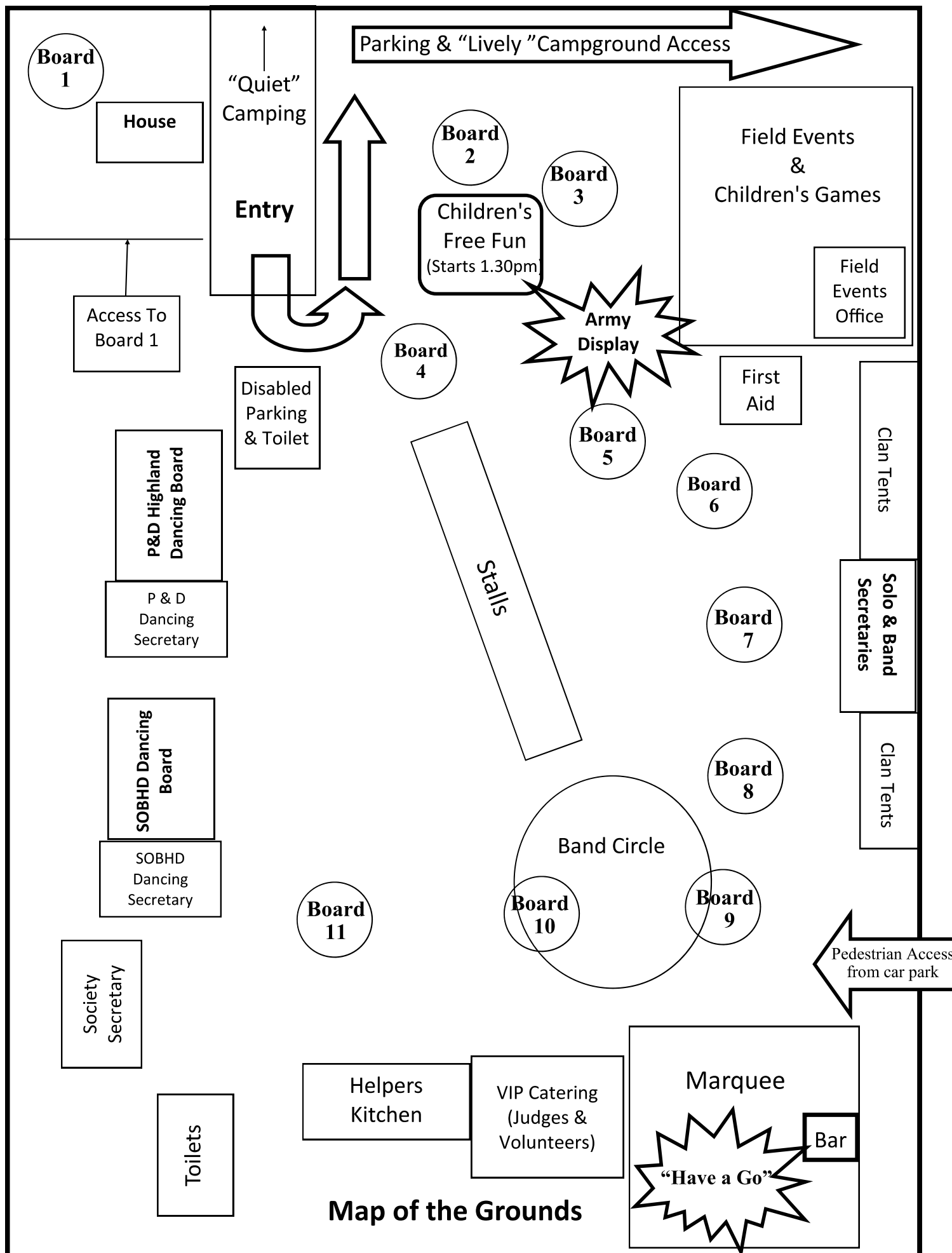

What matters to you? Tell us about it

Taihape's Town Hall is opening its doors to the community for the annual Health & Social Services Expo on March 13, to find out what matters to you

Michelle Fannin is organising the free event, while wearing a few of her community hats: Heartlands Work & Income, Taihape Older & Bolder, and Healthy Families Whanganui.

"We want you to talk to us about what matters to you. Come in and check if any of the organisations you would like to chat with are at the expo."

The day is all about supporting whanau/families in all the ways they need, and ensuring that people know what is already available to them in the remote rural town of Taihape and surrounds.

The aim is to better inform, encourage and support more meaningful conversations between people who provide health and social care, and the people and carers in the community.

Everyone has different needs, and organisers want to identify what they may be.

"Things like having a will," Fannin says. "A lot of our young families don't understand the ramifications of not having a will in place. For others it may be having an enduring power of attorney in place."

An enduring power of attorney is a legal authorisation to act on someone else's behalf in legal and financial matters which can continue in force after the person granting it loses mental

capacity to do so themselves.

"It's mostly around having more meaningful conversations between the organisations that serve the community and the community itself.

"Advanced care plans is another thing that our community nurses can talk about with our whanau/families to be better prepared for whatever the future may hold for them."

Rangitikei District Council will be available to help with things like community housing, rates rebates, and funding applications for groups and organisations.

Department of Internal Affairs

will be there to talk about lotteries and the Community Organisation Grants Scheme, which provides grants to non-profit organisations delivering community-based social services that contribute to achieving locally-determined outcomes.

Enable New Zealand's flagship EASIE Living & Demonstration Centre provides services to disabled and ageing populations who need support to live independently and engage in community activities.

The team will be available to help people find the disability information, services or

equipment they may need.

Whanganui District Health Board will promote its bowel screening programme launched last year, that is aiming for the highest bowel screening rates for Māori across the country in their efforts to increase early detection.

Bowel cancer is the second highest cause of cancer death in New Zealand. It kills as many New Zealanders as breast and prostate cancer combined, and it can affect anyone at any age. But it is treatable and beatable, if it's detected early enough.

Eligible people receive test kits in the mail each year for two



years as part of the WDHB programme. The easy-to-use test, which detects minute blood traces in faeces, is done at home, then the sample is sent away for testing.

"It's really important that our people understand that on their birthday, when that pack gets sent to them, they need to know what to do, and how to follow through."

Other organisations that will be available to help at the expo include: Heartlands Work and Income, Taihape Older and Bolder, Horizons, IRD, Cancer Society, Community Nurses, Taihape Friendship Group, Whanganui Brain Injury Trust, Age Concern Whanganui, Mobility Manawātū, DHB Colon Cancer Screening programme with Mokai Patea Services.

What Matters to You Day 2020

Again this year Older and Bolder coordinator Michelle Fannin has organised the What Matters To You Day to take place in the Taihape Town Hall tomorrow, Friday 13 March.

It's a day all about keeping the community informed and up to date with what organisations come and service Taihape area.

"Find out who can help you and your whanau if and when it is needed. Find out how social services providers can help and support you and your whanau," Michelle says.

"It's about you, your needs, your questions and what support is out there for you."

To answer questions, representatives of many organisations such as Age Concern, Community Law Office, Brain Injury Whanganui, AccessAbility, Mobility Manawatu, Whanganui DHB Mental Health and Addictions Services, Te Oranganui AOD service, Maggie Regan from the DIA and Taihape Older and Bolder and others, will be in attendance.

Michelle stresses that the day is for everyone, not just seniors.

"It's a time when we can find out about such things as preparing wills, Enduring Power of Attorney, Advance Care Planning and what these documents are."

There will be questions asked on the day around housing. Do you want to downsize? Move away? What are your needs with your next house? Community housing?

Last year members of the community said this information service needed to be staged every six months, which is not possible at this stage but Michelle is looking at changing the month and making the event week-long, so more community organisations and their networks can spread the knowledge throughout the Whanganui DHB district.

The free event is open to people of all ages. The Taihape Friendship Group will be at the event making cups of tea.

The Coronavirus (Covid-19) has certainly dominated national and international news over the past few weeks and it's hardly surprising, as the world reacts to this new and significant threat to our global population. It's also proven to have taken its toll on the world's financial markets and trade, while much closer to home, our

foresters, farmers and tourism enterprises are feeling the pain too.

There is however a lot of misinformation and plenty of conspiracy theories out there.

What we do know is (to-date) over 100,000 people worldwide have been infected, more than 3,600 have died and over 60,000 have fully recovered. There is evidence of silent transmission as some people may exhibit symptoms without recognising them as Covid-17.

According to Prof. Michael Baker, from the Dept Public Health at Otago University in Wellington, most scientists agree that now is the time for a maximum containment effort in NZ - and indeed globally. He suggests it would be a game-changer if this virus could be contained and acknowledged in particular China, Singapore, Australia and Taiwan's proactive efforts and their willingness to share information.

While there's no evidence of community spread in NZ at this stage, our most vulnerable citizens need to plan in case of widespread community transmission and we need to help them. It's no secret that widespread community transmission will swamp our health services - and that's

why containment is so important.

This is indeed an issue which must not be muddled with party politics. First and foremost the primary objective is containment, the health and welfare of NZers, and taking care of our most vulnerable. Next we must also address the actual and potential economic and social impact of this virus. It is positive the coalition government has taken steps to front-foot some of the issues that have arisen already, including job losses with respect to our forestry, agriculture, processing, aviation, tourism and hospitality industries. I am encouraged by the PM's comments acknowledging a bi-partisan approach is essential and something they will foster.

Misinformation is not helpful. Blaming those who are unfortunate enough to contract the virus is not helpful. Working together to contain Covid-19 is our best hope for limiting its ability to kill; for avoiding a massive overload on our medical and health providers and for minimising the impact on our work force, industries and essential services. According to Prof Baker, if containment doesn't work here, there's a risk 40% of the population could be infected over the next couple of years. That's not something any one of us is keen to contemplate.

One more thing - congratulations to Sgt Dean Hart, a Royal NZ Airforce technician based in Auckland who ventured south to Ohakea with his homemade dragster determined to break the NZ land speed-record on his first attempt. On Saturday, with an average speed of 363.44km over 1600 metres, he did just that and gave thanks to his team and also the Ohakea runway which provided the perfect location!

Rangitikei Shearing Sports treasurer Angela Coleman was on the money at the group's annual competition in Marton at the weekend, winning the inaugural Phill Hourigan Memorial Trophy.

The new trophy was named in honour of former longtime president, competitor and Turakina shearing contractor, Phill Hourigan who died at the relatively young age of 52 last year.

Donated by Rangitikei businessman, entrepreneur and philanthropist John Turkington and his wife Angela, the Phill Hourigan Trophy recognises "outstanding commitment to the local shearing community".

It was fitting that Coleman won the inaugural trophy, given her ancestry and a work ethic that matched that of the trophy's namesake, who was regarded a true workhorse within the shearing industry.

Coleman is the daughter of Peter Coleman, a longtime shearer who, with Mangamahu farmer Jim Norris, set up the first Rangitikei Shearing Sports event in 1963.

Coleman was totally oblivious to who had won the inaugural award until it was presented.

"I had absolutely no idea, and I was even at the committee meeting when it was decided," Coleman said.

"I think I was out doing some printing or some other practical task at the time it was discussed. Anyway, it was a wonderful gesture and great to find yet another way to pro-

motivate the shearing sports. We are in very good shape at the moment."

Rangitikei Shearing Sports stalwart Marg Martin urged Coleman to join the organisation about seven years ago and everything has stemmed from that conversation.

"Marg asked me to join the committee in the lead up to the 50th event. My dad, Peter Coleman and Jim Norris had put on the first event in 1963, a few months before I was born. As my dad had died in 1975, it was significant that it was still taking place every February 50 years on and I joined Phill's team as treasurer."

"It was a bit challenging at times, but we have an incredibly strong team led by Jake Moore and have just held our 57th event. I thank Tracy [Hourigan's widow] and Conor Hourigan [son] and the Turkingtons for creating this award and the handsome trophy. I was surprised and deeply honoured to be the first person named on it."

"It has led me to be reflect on legacies and what people with passion leave behind, and how sad it is that they aren't with us anymore to see what happens next. Jake had his newborn baby there at the weekend and I immediately recognised that was me at the same age - Dad used to drag me along to the event every year," Coleman recalled.
