#### 2016/2017 Submission Re Koitiata Camp Ground

This little piece of paradise is really starting to be found by more and more people. As you can see by the copy of the visitor's book the overseas backpacker type traveler and the kiwi motorhome traveller are all big users.

The campground consists of 8 powered sites and a large area across the road for non powered sites.

The ammenities consist of an open air sink, two toilets, two showers operated by \$2 coin, gas hot water for showers only. The sink only has cold bore water for use.

There is also a three burner gas barbecue donated by locals.

The water for the showers is trucked in from town water when required to a water storage tank on site. All other water is underground bore water.

The \$2 coins used to pay for the showers goes directly to Council for the cost of the water and bottled gas. There is power to the site with only one power point which is used for the gas infinity. There are no other power points for use by campers for charging phones, laptops etc or for any other use such as cooking. We the Koitiata Residents Committee would like to see the ammenities brought up to the 21st Century.

- 1) Hot water over the sink.
- 2) Cold town water over sink not bore water.
- 3) Two double hot points put in for charging phones, laptops and for campers general use.

The community has it's own Broadband provider which is Inspire Net. They have installed a tower on private land and this has been very successful for the last five years serving the locals well. There is no internet connenction at the campground for campers to access. This again is a must in this day and age. We would like to see this taken on board by Council with Inspire Net.

With regard to Health & Safety issues there is a small concrete water tank collecting water off the roof of the ammenities block sitting on a wooden stand. This stand is starting to rot away and the tank is starting to lean badly. This tank should be removed and the downpipes redirected into the tank that holds the town water.

As a health issue we have also supplied a copy of the water sample for the campground that the council have undertaken.

The approximate cost of removal of tank, shifting of downpipes and supplying hot and cold running water over the sink is \$1,500 plus the installation of power points.

The council has an open wood fired barbecue at the playground area for people to use and yes it does get a lot of use in the summer months. The problem is that there is a total fire ban within 3km's of the coast so how does this comply with the rules? We would like to see the Council supply and install a gas operated stainless steel self cleaning barbecue as per attached.


The residents committee would like to work with council on this and provide and build the roof structure over the facility. We have no costing on this as yet





#### Submission re the Rangitikei District Council 2016/2107 Annual Plan

Multi-sport artificial turf facilities in Marton

Issue A: How should the insurance pay out for the damage to the Centennial Park turf be used?

We support the Rangitikei College proposal to build a multipurpose half turf to replace the damaged turf sited in Centennial Park. This multipurpose half turf would be accessed by all sport users giving the youth of the Rangitikei access to an improved facility. This reduces the barriers to playing sport as costs associated with travel to a practise turf would be minimised.

<u>Issue B:</u> To what extent should the Council make a rate funded contribution to the Nga Tawa and Rangitikei College Turf developments.

Nga Tawa is committed to building a full sized water turf. This project is important for the development of sport at Nga Tawa, and to the development of sport in the wider community as it removes the very real barrier to playing sport due to costs associated with transport to facilities located in Palmerston North and Whanganui. With support from the Rangitikei Council we will be able to ensure access to the turf for other school students in the Rangitikei District. Students who may not otherwise have the financial resources to be able to participate will now have a facility close to home. School students need to be encouraged to play sport and not pursue sedentary life styles as New Zealand is battling increasing levels of obesity and the resulting health issues.

The business community of Marton will also benefit from the turf, as combined with the multisport half turf at Rangitikei College, playing surfaces will be available to host tournaments bringing added revenue to the town.

We support the Council assigning \$100,00 insurance pay-out to Rangitikei College and suggest that rate funded contribution of \$100,00 be made to both Rangitikei and Nga Tawa so that Rangitikei can experience growth in sporting facilities available to the district.

#### SUBMISSION TO RANGITIKEI DISTRICT COUNCIL RE. ROADING

Louisa Gordon 1142 Mokai Road RD 3 TAIHAPE

Recently, we discovered that the District Council have designated that our rural road will only be graded on a quarterly cycle. We are opposed to this.

Admittedly, Mokai Road is a no-exit road to the east of Taihape. However, the eight households who live on the road use it frequently as do trucks and other heavy vehicles servicing the farms; and it is travelled by quite a number of unfamiliar drivers due to the tourism in our district.

Primarily, Tarata Lodge has many guests using the road - many of whom are foreign tourists who have never driven on a metal road. Secondly, people visiting Gravity Canyon bungy often travel to the end of the road to take in the spectacular scenery, and thirdly, many keen trampers and hunters make use of the access to the Ruahine ranges, especially during the "roar". (see attached photo - 12 vehicles in this instance). Unfamiliar drivers are a hazard at the best of times, but when the road is in dire need of a grade, it can be quite dangerous meeting these vehicles on the road.

We know that we have to have sturdy vehicles to live on this road, but the state the road gets in really does some damage to them! It is such a pleasure to drive on the road after it has been graded, but it can be a nightmare when we are waiting for that lovely yellow machine to arrive!

I have had a nasty accident on the road meeting shearers on their way out of the valley - my vehicle was written off and the fact that my four children and I received only minor injuries was very gratifying. My sister has also had a nasty accident, meeting an electrician who was travelling too quickly on an unfamiliar road. Sometimes, it puts you off inviting guests out when we feel the road is unsafe, and it is quite harrowing when you have young drivers who may meet some random tourist having a joy-ride on the corrugations!

I would implore the council to reconsider this policy, and re-grade our road when the residents, and/or council, feel it is in an unsafe state.





- 3. The submitter is responsible for promoting the reduction of adverse environmental effects on the health of people and communities and for improving, promoting and protecting their health pursuant to the New Zealand Public Health and Disability Act 2000 and the Health Act 1956. These statutory obligations are the responsibility of the Ministry of Health and, in the Whanganui Health District are carried out under delegation by the MCPHS.
- 4. The Ministry of Health requires the submitter to reduce potential health risks by such means as submissions to ensure the public health significance of potential adverse effects are adequately considered during policy development.
- 5. The MCPHS welcomes the opportunity to comment on the Rangitikei District Council Annual Plan 2016/17.
- 6. Public health is not just reliant on hospitals but on a responsive environment where all sectors work collaboratively. Health is influenced by a wide range of factors beyond the health sector.
- 7. These influences can be described as the conditions in which people are born, grow, live, work and age, and are impacted by environmental, social and behavioural factors. They are often referred to as the 'social determinants of health'.
- 8. The most effective way to maximize people's wellbeing is to take these factors into account as early as possible during decision making and strategy development. Initiatives to improve health outcomes and overall quality of life must involve organizations and groups beyond the health sector, such as local government if they are to have an impact.

9. The diagram below shows how the various influences on health are complex and interlinked.




Figure 1 Barton, H and Grant, M (2006) A Health Map for the Local Human Habitat







#### Comment

I do not believe that this is a core activity which all ratepayers should be paying for. The total number of youth that are catered for in these programmes is very small and the cost is very high per head. I do support Central Government agency support of youth programmes, but not by local councils.

#### Recommendation

That the Council pursue and support Central Government funding for any youth programmes in the district.

## Should Council construct a new amenity block in Taihape Memorial Park?

 $\square$  Option 2 – I do not support Council's proposal but do support further consideration of refurbishing facilities in the grandstand.

#### Comment

The wording of this question is misleading as Option 1 implies that only \$100,000 to be funded from external agencies is the cost to ratepayers. The total cost is \$600,000 and this should have been stated in the question. I consider this question invalid because of the incomplete and incorrect information contained in it. The council should re-ask this question when the public have been properly informed. At the time of this submission, there was a total failure by the council to inform the public of the details of this proposal. The only people that knew something about it were those involved in council activities or direct involvement with Memorial Park User Group. The rest of the public were totally unaware of this proposal.

Considering that \$600,000 is involved, plus implications for future removal of the existing grandstand in the Park, for which there has previously been a petition by the public stating they do not wish it pulled

down, I think that this needs far more public consultation (not just the Park User Group) before further decisions are made on this plan.

In the information provided in "What's New What's Changed" consultation document, it states that the Council's preferred option, Option 1, is endorsed by the Taihape Community Board. This is totally incorrect information, as the Taihape Community Board only agreed that it should be looked into as an option, and has not made a decision as to whether it supports or not any of the options. This, together with the misleading question in Option 1, invalidates the information provided to the public.

I have supported Option 2 because I do not believe that the Council has a proper evaluation of the work needed and costs to refurbish the current grandstand and I think they should do this to make a fair comparison with the replacement facility that is proposed. That way, the public will have facts to decide on, not just an opinion, which may or may not be correct, as to the cost of work required on the present grandstand.

Proper public consultation on this important and expensive proposal has definitely not been done, and the Council should therefore make a better attempt at fulfilling their duty to consult with the public on this issue. The Council has some excuse for the lack of public awareness in that the local paper closed down at the time of this consultation. But that does not mean they should not restart the process over.

As an aside, the questionnaire did not provide space for other views or comments, as was done with the other questions. This looks bad as it implies the council does not want to hear other views.

#### Recommendation

Because of the misinformation in the consultation document described above, and the lack of public awareness of this proposal, I recommend that the Council revisit this consultation after it has had public meetings or other satisfactory dissemination of correct information to the ratepayers.

I consider an increase in reserve funding is preferable to spending money on additional insurance, the availability of which may be short-lived after the next emergency. In such a case, we would then be back to square one in terms of reserves. I think it is better to be prepared ourselves by increasing the reserves now.

# Should Council proceed with the purchase of the Cobbler/Davenport/Abraham & Williams properties on Broadway/High Street Marton as the site for Council's administration and library services?

☑ Option 1 - Yes, I think this is appropriate given these sites were one of the two preferred locations in the Town centre Plan for Marton's civic centre.

#### Comment

Although all ratepayers in the district will be paying for this facility, I nevertheless believe the decision as to the best site should lie entirely with the people of Marton. My support of Option 1 is therefore conditional on the people of Marton supporting this option. Submissions by the people of Marton should be given greater weight in the decision making than those from outside of Marton.

#### Comment

I believe Council, or a small sub-committee of Council, should have the power to use its discretion in exceptional circumstances to provide partial or total rates remission depending on the circumstances of the individual case. This is a matter of the council showing empathy for those in our society who find themselves unavoidably in distressed circumstances.

#### Other Issues for Council to Consider

#### Taihape Town Hall Heating

As the replacement/refurbishment of Taihape Town Hall will be at least 5 years away, and possibly as much as 10 years, I consider that the council should reactivate the funding it had already approved over 2 years ago for the replacement heating of the Taihape Town Hall. Such heating would probably have a commercial life of 5-7 years anyway and so it would not be a waste for the council to do this for the people of Taihape.

Whether or not the Town Hall is replaced, it is still being used, and the people of Taihape are very upset that there is no heating for the cold months of the year. To expect them to put up with this situation for a further 5-7 years is unreasonable. They have already suffered several years without heating and should not be made to endure this any longer.
