Speed Restrictions on High Street Bulls

To whom it may concern

I'm writing to express my concerns with the speed limit on High Street / Parewanui Road in the township of Bulls.

The present location of the 50km speed restriction sign starts near 176 High street on the approach to the Town.

My main concern is that on the other side of the road residential property including my own extends much further out of town.

My request is that council consider moving the 50km limit further out past the last remaining residential property closer to Ferry Road. I believe that this sign has been situated in this position for probably in excess of fifty years and since then more houses have been built still within the town zone but bordering on what has overtime become the local racetrack. A lot of the traffic leaving town and heading toward Parewanui Road is accelerating and exceeding the speed limit long before it gets to the open road sign. Complaints have been made in the past both verbally and in writing to Traffic/Police only to be told that this doesn't come under a State Highway and appears to have been ignored.

My main reasoning for this request is that most motorists do not brake until after they reach Taumaihi Street. Mowing the berm as we are required to do is extremely unsafe with trucks travelling past me in excess of 90 km and barely a meter away. The other factor to be considered is children crossing High street by Taumaihi Street on their way to and from Clifton Street school.

This request falls under the **Safer Journeys - New Zealand's road safety** strategy 2010-2020.



Reporting a Barking Dog

Persons disturbed or annoyed by the persistent and loud barking or howling of a dog, should report the dog to the local Animal Control Unit. You can find their contact

Upon receipt of your complaint you will be asked to keep a record noting the date, time and length of each barking incident. You will be expected to identify and establish whether the animal is distressed or simply being a nuisance. Armed with this information, Animal Control may:

- 1. Send an officer onsite to assess the situation.
- 2. Notify the owner that their dog has a complaint against it.
- 3. Provide written feedback to the complainant.

If there is no improvement after Animal Control's investigation, and a separate complaint is reported against the same dog, the Council will then take the necessary steps to try to resolve the problem.

It is unlawful for your dog to persistently bark, howl or yelp between the hours of 10:30 p.m. and 7:30 a.m. or when no one is home; resulting in the dog being a public nuisance.

• A violation is defined as at least three "habitual" occurrences in a six-month period of "persistent" noise for 30 minutes or longer.

Barking Dogs

Barking is a normal and healthy means of communication for a domestic dog. However, when the



barking is not responded to in the appropriate manner it may become a nuisance. Under the Dog Control Act 1996 a dog is allowed to bark but not so that it creates a nuisance by persistent and loud barking or howling.

Reporting a barking dog

ð

If you find yourself being affected by persistent and loud barking or howling of a dog, there are a few steps you can take to remedy the problem. Please remember barking problems can take time to remedy.

- **Talk to the owner**. More often than not, dog owners appreciate being made aware that their dog may be causing a nuisance. They may be unaware their dog is creating a nuisance and will look to remedy the problem. If you do not feel comfortable talking to the owner then you can pop the attached flyer into their mailbox.
- **Barking record sheets.** If the barking continues we will require you to complete this attached record sheet. This is necessary so we can demonstrate that we have reasonable grounds to enter onto private property. You will be required to note date, time and length of each barking incident.
- What happens next. If the dog is still creating a nuisance by persistent loud barking or howling. An Animal Education & Control Officer will assess the barking problem and offer advice to the dog owner for remedial actions.

Please contact Animal Education & Control for further information or to report a barking dog.

If you suspect your dog is barking

A dog barking from boredom or seeking attention can create a nuisance to neighbours. If you suspect your dog of barking while you are away consult with your neighbours asking them to monitor the barking while you are not home. Also when you are at home and your dog barks you should rectify the problem immediately.

Preventing nuisance barking:

- Keep your dog occupied.
- Ensure your dog is comfortable.
- Ensure your dog has adequate daily exercise.
- Ensure each day you spend time with your dog.
- Bones, toys, balls etc. will help keep your dog amused during the day.
- Leave your dog with friends, family or doggy day care if you think this may help.
- House the dog in a position where he/she cannot see things to bark at.
- House the dog near other animals for companionship.
- NEVER hit your dog. This only builds mistrust and will not stop nuisance barking.
- Obedience exercises help stimulate your dog and prevent behavioural issues like barking.
- If all else fails seek advise from a professional such as a dog trainer, local obedience club, Animal Education & Control Officer, SPCA or your local vet.

1. INTRODUCTION

This policy demonstrates how Horizon responds to complaints and other customer feedback such that it complies with the requirements of the Scottish Public Services Ombudsman's for Housing Association complaint handling.

2. SCOPE

The policy sets out how we will handle complaints and positive customer feedback

3. **PRINCIPLES**

The following principles govern the operation of this policy:

- Customer feedback about the services we provide is welcomed, noted, acknowledged and reviewed.
- Feedback received about policies and procedures is taken into account at the next relevant review.
- Front line employees are encouraged to offer and implement immediate responses to complaints where appropriate and meeting the reasonable expectations of the customer.

4. **OBJECTIVES**

The objectives of the policy are to ensure that:

- Wherever practical and possible, complaints are resolved informally by front line employees.
- People providing feedback know that their comments will be used to evaluate the quality of our services and to influence reviews of policies and procedures.
- Records of feedback will be organised for ease of retrieval and analysis.
- Should complaints be referred to external agencies we shall be able to provide records of each case to assist further investigation.
- People making complaints are advised clearly about the process and their opportunities to escalate the case to independent authorities.

5. APPROACH AND METHOD

Horizon's Board, in its formal approval of the policy, accepts full responsibility for the policy and ensuring its implementation. Day to day responsibility for the operation and monitoring of this policy lies with the Operations Director and Service Managers. All relevant employees have a responsibility to ensure that the policy is applied as instructed.

The policy will be implemented using the following approaches:

- We shall devise systems and procedures for compliance with the policy
- We shall record positive feedback, constructive criticism and complaints impartially
- We shall review procedures at least every 3 years and implement measures to improve efficiency and customer satisfaction
- Complaints will be handled in accordance with Horizon's Complaints Handling Procedure (adapted from the model issued by the Scottish Public Services Ombudsman): this is a two stage process, with the appended flow chart reflecting the approach and required timescales.
- We will provide training and support for staff to build confidence and skill in responding to customer feedback, resolving complaints at the earliest opportunity, and investigating complaints where this is required.

6. MONITORING, PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT AND REPORTING

We will monitor, evaluate and report on customer feedback as follows:

- Provision of training and / or information to staff
- The need for review of policy, procedure or practice
- Feedback will be analysed for trends in the nature and frequency of subjects which are cause for complain or positive feedback.
- Numbers of complaints, numbers resolved at each stage, numbers referred to the Ombudsman or other external agencies, and any unresolved at the time of reporting.
- Assessment of the extent to which complaints are resolved at each stage to the satisfaction of the complainer.

Service Managers will hold this responsibility, reporting to the Operations Director. The Managing Director will deal with any significant issues of concern should these arise, reporting these to the Board and to Link Group Chief Executive if appropriate.

Quantitative information on complaints and compliance with resolution and investigation timescales will be provided to the Board within the quarterly Key Performance Indicators report. A short quarterly summary of complaints received and resolutions will be posted on the internet and so available to tenants and external stakeholders. An annual customer feedback report will be made to the Board and to tenants, which also reports on any changes to policy or practice made as a result of feedback.

The Internal Auditor and / or the Link Group Strategy & Business Support Team may carry out audit of compliance with the policy, reporting to Horizon's Audit Sub-Committee, and to Link Group's Audit Committee,

7 APPEALS

In accordance with the Model Complaints Handling Procedure, if after making a complaint to Horizon complainer remains dissatisfied he/she may be able to refer the matter to the Scottish Public Services Ombudsman. Horizon will advise complainers on conclusion of a Stage 2 investigation that this is their right Horizon will also advise the complainer if a service other than the Ombudsman would be more appropriate to consider the case.

8 REPEATED COMPLAINTS AND UNACCEPTABLE ACTIONS

A small minority of complaints may not be accepted. This will be the case when the same complaint has been addressed and we have given a final decision at the end of stage 2 of the CHP. We may also decline to consider complaints in which no clearly identifiable issue can be determined, or where the complainant continually raises new issues following completion of our investigations. These complaints place a strain on time and resources to the disadvantage of other tenants or customers. Horizon's Unacceptable Actions Policy sets out actions which the Association considers to be unacceptable in pursuing a complaint, and its policy for managing such actions.

9 EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY





COMPLAINTS - FIRST DRAFT OF FLOW-CHART - INVESTIGATION STAGE





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

Council's Policy <u>may</u> also require all menacing dogs to be neutered
