From: Max Shierlaw. To be read at the meeting by Cr Wong

My family emigrated to Taihape in 1975. I went to school and spent the first few years of my working life in Taihape.

I have many fond memories of playing badminton in the Town Hall and watching rugby from the Memorial Park grandstand.

I served for nine years as a Hutt City Councillor so I am familiar with Annual Plan and Long Term Plan processes.

I have concerns that the community are being corralled into deciding between two very narrow options in relation to these two important Taihape community assets.

In the case of the Grandstand, the Council's preferred option is unrealistic. It provides less than half the required funding for strengthening and upgrading this historic asset. The Plan makes no mention of how the remainder is to be raised.

It is unrealistic to expect the Taihape community to raise more than \$1m toward the cost of upgrading the Grandstand. No funder will contribute money toward upgrading a Council asset. It would be different if say the Taihape Squash Club were extending their premises. Community funders may well contribute toward upgrading a privately owned community facility. They would not contribute toward a Council owned facility.

The only possible option for raising the shortfall to upgrade the Grandstand would be by way of a targeted rate on Taihape properties. If that is the Council's secret agenda, it needs to come out and say so now.

This situation could be seen as galling for the Taihape community when the Council is proposing to spend more than \$30m upgrading the Marton Town Centre. Ratepayers are being corralled into believing an upgrade of that financial magnitude is required. There are no options in Annual Plan for an upgrade that costs significantly less. Having been involved Council infrastructure planning for nine years, I know that many options are considered behind the scenes before anything is made public.

The Council should agree to fully fund the upgrade of both the Taihape Town Hall and Memorial Park Grandstand, and reduce the budget of the Marton Town Centre upgrade to compensate.





Taihape Town Hall - service & value

This building is the centre of the community not only physically but a centre that every local visits at some stage or other thus the relationship is quite a personal one. It is truly part of the fabric of Taihape and Taihapeans in so many ways. Apart from this it is a much-photographed building by passer-by's who consider it a most iconic building with outstanding features. The colour scheme reflects Taihape features- the papa cliffs, the sky, the river & the kowhai.

There are so many areas of the building that are used by the community – the full usage has never been published & it is timely to do so, so there is a complete understanding of its worth.

Front ground floor;

- Community board chambers& meeting rooms for the community groups & staff meetings
- Public Toilets best in town-for travelling public-staff-locals.
- service centre for 7 days-locals to pay rates-dog licenses etc.
- library for 7 days-place for locals to read papers-peruse books.
- information centre for 7 days-for travelling public-bus ticket sales for locals & travellers.
- Computer services-for travellers, students, locals

Front Upstairs accommodates.

- the RDC property managers office
- the TCDT office
- The TCDT storage rooms at the rear of the upstairs seating
- The upstairs seating for shows
- The staff kitchen also used as an evening meeting room
- bathroom facilities

The Auditorium.

- · Hall (at present unheated) capable of seating 300 people
- stage & auditorium considered capable & suitable for RNZB & NZSO, drama groups, school concerts, local ballet concerts, funerals, weddings, balls, centenaries, badminton & indoor bowls, etc, etc with changing rooms in the wings of the stage with toilet facilities.
- stage storage of 300 seats for the auditorium seating
- stage special sloping floor, lighting

Downstairs of the Auditorium (known as supper rooms);

- Male & female toilet facilities
- Meeting room for community with kitchen facilities & outside access & inside stairs to auditorium

- Friendship Group meeting room
- 3 Storage rooms for various groups such the garden club, KTB Christmas lights & RDC excess equipment, seating & any other group requiring storage for community.

Back of Hall upstairs side rooms (outside access);

Underneath the building.

- Storage of old equipment
- An outdated heating installation plenty of room for an updated heating/cooling system

Concern has been expressed why this building has not in the past been considered as a registered Heritage Building.

Considering all of the above, the main concern is if we don't have this Town Hall how and where do we accommodate all of the above facilities, activities and events?

Taihapes population is growing & with interest from city areas to move to rural towns it is time to consider retention of all buildings with potential to accommodate new activities.

I have placed my submission on the three items under consideration from least painful to most painful.

1. Taihape Town Hall/Civic Centre

I prefer for Taihape residents to have their own say on this matter.

2. Footpath Calico Line

Construct the basic footpath along Calico Line without waiting for funding from Waka Kotahi, otherwise it might never get built. I would urge Council, however, to give priority towards laying the shared footpath/cycle way along Nga Tawa Road ahead of Calico Line if they can't both be completed the same year. At least there is one of sorts on Calico Line, but Nga Tawa Road has nothing right now.

3. Marton Civic Centre

Page 13 of the discussion document gives an indicative cost of \$33 million for provision of a new integrated civic centre for Marton, the second most expensive project on the list next to district roading improvements and maintenance. It is incongruously near the bottom of the list in terms of actual benefit to the ratepayers, in my view at least. Giving due regard to the expense, lack of tangible benefit to the community and the anticipated 9 percent rate hike for 2023/24 I cannot see how either option can be justified. I have never supported Council's purchase of the corner site to build a new civic centre, when the existing library and council offices are approximately just 200 metres and 400 metres further along High Street respectively. The notion of selling the redundant land and buildings to offset some of this cost is quite frankly a nonsense, especially now the real estate market has turned. I accept the council offices are not fit for purpose, and the 1950s war memorial building could do with some loving, however I just cannot see how a nice shiny new building next to the southern roundabout is going to make me cheerfully part with another \$250-odd a year in rates. Of course there is no guarantee there won't be significant cost overruns, as I believe there were with the Bulls facility.

To my mind Council should do the following:

- A) demolish the existing brick building that formerly accommodated MDC shared services staff within the administration compound.
- B) construct a new, modest, fit-for-purpose office complex for staff with council chambers (modest being the operative word)
- C) demolish the old office block and improve parking, vehicle storage etc. (the new building could be built in two stages to enable additions to be made as more space is cleared on the site)
- D) as the War Memorial Building is basically sound (albeit ugly) and well located, it could be refitted with a decent kitchen and ablution facilities with showers, and given a facelift. The land to the rear presently being maintained to a minimal standard can be used to improve car parking
- E) the library in Marton isn't the world's best, but is adequate for the few of us who use it. It could probably be left alone. Besides, I can see more of a business case for improving the WMC as that is frequently hired out.
- 4. One other possible road safety improvement that should be considered for the future is widening of the bridge situated at the bottom of Wellington Road, near State Highway 1. It operates as a two-lane bridge, but is barely wide enough for two vehicles to pass side by side, especially if one is a truck turning into Wellington Road from the highway.

My thoughts. I do not wish to speak to this submission.

On top of your rates, we also have to pay for our own services directly – fresh water collection, storage and filtration, waste water and storm water disposal, and take our rubbish to the transfer station and pay for each load. Farming costs are increasing at twice the CPI, and farming returns are falling. Don't ask us for more!





The present location of Hautapu St is central in the town.

Parking in Kokako Street is already a problem when tournaments, Horse sports and funerals are held.

Funding is already promised to the upgrade of the grandstand and it could have a heritage listing, which may or may not remain if it becomes a Town Hall/civic centre. It will still be a grandstand!

A sports hub is being built at Memorial Park and this project took a long time to come to fruition, due to a range of interests and lobbying. I am not a sports person, so I am neutral on this decision, and I can see benefits for the community.

Did the council do costings etc for a new Town Hall, by way of a comparison?



The road is more and more being used by non-rural transport companies and tourists particularly recently with both the Taupo-Napier and Manawatu-Napeir roads having significant traffic delays and/or closures.
- The Council caps the percentage rates increase to no greater than stated in the Council's 2021 Long Term Plan for the 2023/24 financial year and reduce expenditure to ensure there is no need for loans to cover the revenue shortfall. And that the average rate increases for rural properties are no more than for residential properties. A number of rural properties had significant rate increases ((20%+) at the last review.
