I support partnering with other councils across



Manawatu-Whanganui (Manawatu DC?) but prefer not to collaborate with PNCC. I also fully support the proposed 3 CCO model Rangitikei DC proposed and believe the centralised system should've been implemented years ago (3 Waters period during previous gov't) for improved environmental outcomes. Kiwis deserve safe, accessible and resilient 3 Waters services and keeping to the status quo (as it has been for decades) is not an option. 





Response to question; What are the key factors influencing your rating of the three models

My main concern with each of the models is cost to the ratepayer. While it seems clear at this stage of the proposed implementation of Local Water Done Well that there will be some trade off with rates to allow householders to meet water costs, what I think is not at all clear, is the set up costs of the CCO's.

Setting a brand new organisation is going to be expensive what ever size it is. Scale then needs to come into this. If set up costs or transition costs can be spread as widely as possible (in terms of population) then the cost is going to be less to the individual ratepayer than a model which uses a lower population base. I personally don't think Rangitikei councillors have given enough weight to this in establishing a preferred option of going with a three council CCO.

Rates rises in most communities in New Zealand I believe have nearly reached tipping point where they are unsustainable for the future. Central Government is well aware of this and I believe they will act in the future to limit Local Government rates rises to the point where they are acceptable and affordable within the districts, cities or regions. Rangitikei Council in its deliberations on what model to adopt needs to take into account any financial impact on the ratepayer with the Local Water proposed reforms. By doing this they will demonstrate to Central Government they are concerned about impacts on ratepayers, and they just might receive a better hearing by the central decision body.

Finally, I would like to take the opportunity to thank the Rangitikei District Council and Mayor for what I think has been a very good consultation process on Water. There's a challenge here for the council and that is to replicate the process for Long Term Plan consultations.

IROMAR agrees with the advantages outlined in Page 13 Where's Water @ Rangitikei:

- a) Whanganui District Council has shown that a small city can sustainably manage water sector assets both technically and financially.
- b) RDC has stated that it will be able to focus on other community priorities post water sector entity formation. IRO-MAR encourages RDC to take the opportunity to resize, identify and prioritise

- the skills required to deliver the intent of reforms that are currently being promoted by Central Government, significantly reduce operating overheads and reduce increases in rates.
- c) Each of the three Councils has indicated that there are benefits in the model and there is general concurrence that the three TLAS can work together in the new entity.

Concerns:

- d) A new water entity CCO will be established which will be independent from RDC; however RDC will have a shareholding in the CCO. It is unclear from the Where's Water @ Rangitīkei document if RDC will have liabilities and/or risk with that shareholding. CCO's will have the ability to borrow significantly more money to provide water infrastructure required to deliver 3 Waters. IRO-MAR would like to understand clearly RDC's risks and liabilities with a shareholding in the CCO.
- e) IRO-MAR is concerned that the number of water connections deemed economically sustainable in the new CCO model is far greater than the collective number of connections in the Whanganui District Council, Ruapehu District Council and Rangitīkei District Council.

IRO-MAR does not support this option. Score 1

Model 3: CCO with as many Manawatu – Whanganui Councils as possible.

IROMAR does not support this model. Score 3

Advantages and disadvantages

- a) The advantages and disadvantages Where's Water @Rangitikei page 16 are accepted as valid. Apart from the fact that some of the Councils have already stated a preference that does not include Rangitīkei indicates that this model is only likely to happen if directed by Central Government.
- b) If this model was to be seriously considered more detailed analysis (SWOT) would be needed to identify the impact on Rangitikei . Palmerston North for example needs massive water infrastructure investment , Manawatu and Whanganui District Councils have been competently investing in their systems over many years but others including Rangitikei have not.
- c) Price Harmonisation for this model may still leave Rangitikei with higher unit costs than predicted and maybe a difficult issue to resolve. Whanganui District Council has funded/delivered an Asset Management Plan for over at least a decade whereas Rangitīkei and Ruapehu have not. Price harmonisation modelling and decision-making given the disparities could involve difficult discussions and decisions.

- 4. Push back on government initiatives must increase. We cannot afford to fluoridate any let alone all our towns, and our ground water is high quality and not desirous if excessive treatment with costly chlorine.
- 5. Efficient filters and UV treatment (bearing in mind the quality laminar UV system designed by Massey staff is available now) can be used for drinking water, and sewerage does NOT need to be discharged to land to seemingly only appease a small minority. There is zero reasoning or justification for land based discharge no matter how it is framed. Systems are available that mitigate ALL the minorities' concerns into the river.

It is costly, inefficient, dangerous to the land (especially by concentrating the additional chemicals added to water, and those brought up out of the ground over time).

6. I believe that Stormwater would also suffer under the push for raising funds for the mad panic to satisfy central government wants for sewerage and potable water. SW is a major problem that is only getting worse, and the lack of strategic focus has caused damage to downstream properties. Consideration of our concerns is not consulted on. E.g. The Solar farms will definitely change the profile of SW discharge, but we were told it was mitigated or neglible. However, typically, no modelling was provided and only a cursory statement made on this significant subject. We demand more input into these matters, and only a fully council responsibility will allow the ratepayer their concerns. A CCO will ignore even harder than

council has done in the past. At least we get to vote bad listeners out, whereas the CCO is appointed for many more years than council term.





Submission - Local Water Done Well 2 April 2025

Tēnā koe,

The future of water and water services is of substantial interest to lwi.

Ownership over and the right to control water remains subject to hapū and iwi claims under Te Tiriti o Waitangi. Te Rūnanga o Ngā Wairiki – Ngāti Apa actively upholds the interests and claims of the Ngā Wairiki me Ngāti Apa people in the Rangitīkei District, and in the neighbouring Whanganui and Manawatū Districts. Our ancestors did not cede sovereignty when they signed Te Tiriti o Waitangi, and as such, did not cede rights over their lands and waters. This is a principle position for Te Rūnanga o Ngā Wairiki – Ngāti Apa when considering the Local Water Done Well reforms and the proposed approach set out by the Rangitīkei District Council.

The hapū and Iwi of Ngā Wairiki me Ngāti Apa had lived on these lands for centuries prior to signing Te Tiriti o Waitangi. In 1848, Tiriti signatory Kawana Te Hakeke wrote about his vision for the growth of his people. The 1849 Rangitīkei Turakina Transaction was supposed to secure the future for Ngā Wairiki me Ngāti Apa, not cause the demise of these tribal institutions and the impoverishment of Ngā Wairiki and Ngāti Apa people. The Crown apologised for this transaction in 2008 and settlement assets making up between 1% and 2% of what was lost by the Iwi were returned in 2011.

Te Rūnanga o Ngā Wairiki – Ngāti Apa is growing the Iwi asset base and these tribal institutions are getting stronger, and we are growing our influence across multiple domains. Importantly, our hapū and iwi only have one home. This is primarily in the southern Rangitīkei District. We are committed to our people and to our tribal lands and the communities that live here. How this relates to a conversation about the future of water is that we see ourselves as appropriate people to be involved in infrastructure planning, investment and ownership. We wish we could be seen as a trusted party to any and all arrangements that affect the long term future of this district, because we will always be here. Not even the Rangitīkei District Council can claim this distinction.

Responding to the situation at hand, the practical realities around aging infrastructure and modern environmental and hygiene standards has given rise to years of debate about how to address what has become a national challenge. The previous Labour government developed the proposed 3 waters reforms, and these were disposed of by the National led coalition government who have introduced Local Water Done Well. This coalition government has worked hard to remove Treaty clauses from a wide range of legislation including their water reforms.

With specific reference to Local Water Done Well Iwi leadership has challenged local government to find ways to protect gains that have been made with local relationships involving hapū and iwi. It should be recalled when the matter arose in 2020 about removing the statue of Captain Cook,

it was agreed that, rather than remove these reminders of the past, Council and Iwi would work together to ensure that future development reflects the spirit of partnership and a commitment to equity and fairness. Here we are faced with a big decision about water. From a Rūnanga perspective, this is no different to building a statue or a playground, the principle of partnership remains the same. The expectation of Te Rūnanga o Ngā Wairiki – Ngāti Apa with respect to Local Water Done Well is that the Rangitīkei District Council will work to ensure that hapū and iwi can play a significant role in the future management of water.

Whilst suggesting what Council's moral obligation may be to our iwi, there is also some legislative provision for Iwi expectations for partnership and participation. We have both the Te Awa Tupua settlement legislation and the Te Waiū o Te Ika settlement legislation that specifically underwrite our position.

With respect to the proposals to form a CCO for the Rangitikei, Whanganui and Ruapehu districts to address three waters, one observation is that no clear provision has been made for hapū and iwi participation. It is acknowledged that the door is still open for conversation, but there is no undertaking to get hapū and iwi agreement before proceeding with these proposals. It is our opinion that more should have been done by this point to put detailed suggestions in front of iwi about how our interests might be met. Iwi are accustomed to processes where the door is kept open for discussion about iwi interests only for iwi to be left disappointed at the end. This process feels like it is heading in the same direction.

There is little more that we can offer in response to the options presented to the community for Local Water Done Well. The key conclusion for iwi is that we need to know from Council how our hapū and iwi interests will be accommodated in the future of three waters and Local Water Done Well.






How would you rate your level of support for Model 1?
