Dear Carla and Greg,  
Just to cover off the points we have discussed:

1. Please can you provide a letter from the Principal (Greg), confirming that the tutoring of a Kapa Haka (KH) group is an additional activity to complement and enhance your teaching programme (co-curricular or extra-curricular), and not part of normal school curriculum and teaching programmes. You could say something about establishing a skill base within the student body with the long term view of creating KH as a part of the curriculum? (there is another round of CCS funding in Oct/Nov where funds could be applied for for a KH Concert, especially if it was open to the public and held in another venue from the school...just a thought :-)) and no need to mention at this stage.)

2. We need a named Tutor for the 25 week course as CCS is interested in funding specific people who are able to transfer skills. Funding for this person would be non-transferable, i.e. a normal member of staff would not be permitted to take over this role during the 25 week course.
