7 Hunterville Town Centre Plan

The Hunterville Town Centre Plan Steering Group and member of the community held a working bee at Queens Park on 21 February 2015. This is the first stage of the Town Centre Plan. The group replaced seating and picnic tables and painted them bright colours. Low hanging trees around the camping and picnic area were also trimmed to increase visibility of the area.



The next project is to create a trail from the Hunterway sculpture, through Queens Park and across the state highway into Bruce Street. The trail will have a rural theme, incorporating farm fencing that directs people across the state highway and towards the sheep sculptures in Bruce Street.

9 Small Projects Grant Scheme

The balance of the Small Projects Grant Scheme for the Hunterville Ward is \$488 (being the allocation of \$888 minus the \$400 spent).

10 Policy on Insanitary and dangerous buildings

It is a statutory requirement under section 131 of the Building Act 2004 for every Council to have a Dangerous and Insanitary Buildings Policy. Section 132(4) of that Act requires the policy to be reviewed by Council every five years. At its meeting on 26 February 2015, Council adopted the draft policy for public consultation using special consultative procedure as set out in section 83 of the Local Government Act 2002. The main changes from the earlier policy address the new legislative requirement to address "affected" (i.e. neighbouring) buildings and dangerous dams.

This draft policy was out for public consultation during the period 2 March 2015 to 2 April 2015.
