11 Hunterville township test bore update

A site has been identified in the Hunterville Domain for a test bore for a new water source for the Hunterville Township. There is cost efficiency to expand the scope of the work to include drilling the test bore and getting that bore to production status. A yield of between 200 and 400 cubic metres per day would be needed for a production bore to be viable. A new request for tender was issued to allow for the progression with a production bore should the test bore process verify good water (volume and quality).

At its meeting on 11 October 2018 (reconvened from 27 September 2018), Council awarded Contract C1096 for construction of the Hunterville Bore to Interdrill Ltd.

12 Tutaenui Community Irrigation/Stock water scheme – update on progressing the completed pre-feasibility study

Part of the capability grant recently received from the Provincial Growth Fund is being used to prepare the case for a feasibility study for a Tutaenui Rural Water Scheme.
