9.2 Rural water supplies-options under the Government's three waters reform programme

Mr Hodder took the committee through the report. There is uncertainty with rural water supply from central government, they have set up a working group specifically for the issues, which include the new regulations for drinking water and the mixed use of water from rural water supplies.

The committee acknowledged that there is mixed water usage and therefore it is a waste of resources investigating this. It does mean that the committee is subject to the requirements set by the Water Services Regulator. The Water Services Regulator has approved other solutions but the committee referenced other schemes and the costs associated with this.

The committee is aware that if the supply stayed with Council there would be a loss of expertise as staff will transition to the new entity. Council is able to provide administrative support providing rate invoices and setting levy rates. Mr Tombs would be the best to advise on the financial impact of the scheme staying with Council. The committee acknowledged the need for Council expertise to keep tabs on specific titles. The entity will have to subcontract because they won't have the expertise either.

The committee were concerned regarding the 75% vote and that it needs better clarification whether voting is weighted to units owned or individuals who are a part of the scheme. Mr Hodder stated it was likely equal vote to those in the scheme.

There is an urgency to remove Hunterville Township from the scheme and there have been issues finding a formal agreement between the rural water supply and the township. There needs to be clear communication with the township regarding three waters and what this will mean for the township regarding who will be supplying the water and the rates costs for this.

The Committee recommended a report to Council early in the new year to investigate withdrawing from the entity.

- b. if the supply to farmers on the Hunterville scheme is found to be 'mixed use' and if the National Transition Unit deems the supply to farmers on the Hunterville scheme is a separate supply, decide (in consultation with scheme members) whether this portion of the Hunterville scheme is to be put forward as an exception to automatic transfer to the Western Central Services Entity.

10.1 Three Waters Submission

1. Three Waters Update:

- 1.1 The meetings scheduled in late January 2023 with all members of the rural scheme committees were cancelled. The new Prime Minister had signalled his intention to "re-set" some of the Government's programmes with potential implications for the three waters reform. The Prime Minister's statement to Parliament on 21 February 2023 signalled the Government's intention to "refocus our reforms and work with local authorities to tackle this challenge" but without specifying the timing.
- 1.2 The other issue flagged in cancelling the January meetings was the provisions in the Water Services Legislation Bill introduced into Parliament last December. Council has made a submission to Parliament's Finance and Expenditure Committee on this bill, and here is the link to that submission:
