13 Update on wastewater treatment plant (and meetings of reference advisory group)

Council officers have been working with Horizons on a joint funding request through the fresh water improvement fund, and hope to have a decision by mid-August. The reference group will be convened following this decision.

The application to the Ministry for the Environment Freshwater Improvement Fund to seek financial support for a land-based treatment option for the Ratana WWTP was successful. This means that the discharge will be entirely to land with none going into Lake Waipu as is the case now.

A project plan will now be developed, noting that a new resource consent application will need to be lodged with Horizons Regional Council by 31 January 2018 (being 6 months ahead of the 31 July 2018 expiry of the current consent.

20 Change to fees made under the Resource Management Act 1991 - Consultation

Mr McNeil provided an outline of the changes to the Resource Management Act which introduced a consenting process for minor non-complying activities, such as boundary setbacks. The amendment requires councils to introduce a new fee structure cover these matters, which must be publicly consulted on before they can be confirmed.

The written submission period is open until 1 September 2017. The consultation documents (including submission form) are on the Council website. Oral hearings will be held on 14 September 2017 at the Policy/Planning Committee meeting.

21 Late Items

Cr Peke-Mason provided an outline on Andrew Judd's petition to Parliament concerning the process for establishing Maori wards. This is a public process and submissions close 24 August

Mr McNeil provided an indicative layout for the extension/upgrade of the access road to the Urupa. Board members were in general agreement with the proposals.

His Worship the Mayor provided an update on discussions between the NZ and Singapore Governments on a proposal to establish a training base at Ohakea for the Singapore Air Force. It was noted that an extensive impact assessment process is underway, which should be completed by the end of the year. It was also noted that there would be a short visit in late August of a jet squadron from the Singapore Air Force.

Mr McNeil outlined the Tourism Infrastructure Fund, which was recently announced by the Government as a funding opportunity for councils to help fund infrastructure to meet the pressures associated with visitors. It was felt that the number of visitors to Ratana would meet the fund criteria, with parking, toilets and wastewater capacity being particular pressure points for the community.

SUBJECT: Ratana Water Treatment Plant Update

TO: Ratana Board

1. General

Below are bullet points providing an update on progress for each of the key work elements of the Ratana Water Treatment Plant.

2. Building Construction

Construction of the building is complete.

3. Treatment Process

- Installation of the water treatment process equipment has been completed.
- Commissioning had commenced but was abandoned due to a lack of water pressure.
 After further investigation, the issue was traced back to the bore where it was discovered that a fine sand was being pumped into the plant which congested the ion exchangers.

4. Reservoir Construction

• The reservoir has been completed and has been connected into the plant.

5. Bore

- During the commissioning of the plant it was revealed that the bore was pumping a
 fine sand with the water it supplied to the plant causing congestion of the ion
 exchangers and preventing the completion of commissioning.
- The recent seismic activity is thought to have loosed the fine sand around the bore screens. We've advised by drilling professionals and an external consultant that the bore requires redevelopment. This has been scheduled to take place at the end of October.

6. Power Supply

- Power supply delays were the cause of planned commissioning earlier in the year.
- Power supply to the plant has been completed.

7. Vehicle Crossing and General Site Works

 The vehicle crossing and general tidy up of the site will take place after bore redevelopment.

8. Fencing

- A 2.3m high 50mm Chain link mesh fence with 3 runs of barbed wire will be erected approximately 1m inside the boundary around the plant.
- Materials for the fence have been purchased and is scheduled to be installed after the vehicle crossing is completed.

9. Commissioning

- Commissioning of the plant is expected to take up to 2 weeks
- Commissioning is scheduled to be undertaken in the second week of November.

10. Ministry of Health Subsidy

• To date \$565k of the subsidy has been claimed with a further \$470k due to be claimed at the completion of the project.
