Stakeholder Update

Following the Community Boards October resolution:

18/RCB/024 - That the Rātana Community Board consider the opportunity for a Rātana-specific icon/image for the signage at the entry to the Paa and provide a recommendation to Council.

Council has agreed to include Māori place names, with the appropriate macrons (including council and district logo sets) in all its signage. As Rātana is both the commonly used Māori and Pākehā name for the township, the name Rātana will be stand alone.

The design and rendering for the signage has been completed, with staff now just awaiting the appropriate Rātana-specific icon/image from the community. Examples of potential icons (for discussion purposes only) have been attached, see <u>Appendix 1</u>.

It is the request from staff, that the Rātana Community Board notify Mr Jamieson (Rangitīkei District Council – Strategy & Community Planning Manager) of the preferred township icon/image, either now or at its earliest convenience.

Once an icon/image has been presented to Mr Jamieson, the Board can expect the signs to be produced and installed within two months.

Recommendations
