1 Background

- 1.1 The Rural Travel Fund was developed in response to concerns raised by territorial authorities about the lack of participation in sport by young people living in rural communities. Geographical isolation, urban drift, lack of employment opportunities and access to mainstream funding were identified as barriers to sport participation.
- 1.2 The Sport NZ Rural Travel Fund is a partnership between Sport New Zealand and territorial authorities to assist the development of junior sport in rural communities by providing a travel subsidy targeted at young people aged between 5-19 years.
- 1.3 The Rural Travel Fund is designed to help subsidise travel for junior teams participating in local sport competition. The allocation of the fund is based on a population density formula for territorial authorities who have less than 10 people per square kilometre. The total sum available for this funding round is \$9,500+GST.
- 1.4 The Assessment Committee are provided with copies of the applications received for the funding to be distributed for 2017/18 separate to the Order Paper. The application and assessment process that has been followed for this year is the same as for previous years.
- 1.5 This report also provides the Assessment Committee with the accountability reports for those organisations that received funding last year. This is to enable the Committee to satisfy itself that the public money distributed for the fund has been used for the purpose for which it was intended.

2 Rural Travel Fund Accountability reports

2.1 At last years Assessment Committee the following allocation of the Sport NZ Rural Travel Fund were approved:

•	Rangitikei College	\$2,210
•	Hunterville Sports Club	\$1,946
•	James Cook School	\$397.90
•	Taihape Area School	\$5,746.55

- 2.2 Successful applicants are required to complete an accountability form. These have been received from two of the 2016/17 applicants.
- 2.3 Accountability reports have been requested from the remaining successful applicants. If any of these are available they will be tabled at the meeting.
- 2.4 Those Accountability Reports that are available are attached for the Committee's reference as <u>Appendix 1</u>. The Rural Travel Fund Summary for 2016/17 and Reconciliation Report are attached as <u>Appendix 2</u>.

3 Rural Travel Fund Eligibility Criteria 2017/18

- 3.1 Applications for the Rural Travel Fund are open to rural sports clubs and rural school teams with young people aged between 5-19 years who require subsidies to assist with transport expenses to local sporting competitions. For a number of sporting codes, the small number of Rangitikei-based competitions means that local competition includes games in neighbouring centres such as Wanganui and Palmerston North.
- 3.2 The Rural Travel Fund is to be managed by the territorial authority, but Sport NZ has a specific prohibition against funding for the purpose of travel to regional or national events.
- 3.3 Sport NZ requires the following criteria to be applied when considering applications for funding. School club teams and sport club teams are defined as:

"a school club team participating in regular local sport competition out of school time, that excludes inter school and intra school competitions played during school time" and / or "a sports club team participating in organised, regular sport competition through club membership outside of school time"

3.4 The Sport NZ Rural Travel Fund does not cover travel to practice sessions.

4 Rural Travel Fund applications received for 2017/18

- 4.1 Seven applications to the scheme have been received with a total of 886 participants. The seven applications comply with the criteria. They are included as a separate document. The summary report form is attached as <u>Appendix 3</u>.
- 4.2 Six of the applicants have received funding in past years. The application from Huntley School is new.
- 4.3 The total sum sought is \$26,000, which is more than twice the amount available for distribution.
- 4.4 The amount being claimed varies greatly with all groups claiming for the same sporting code. Worked on a price per participant the amounts being requested vary from \$15 per participant through to \$48 per participant.
- 4.5 Previously, the Committee has allocated the grant on a "per participant" basis, with some weighting towards those with further to travel (option 2).

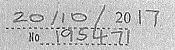

If the government or employer contributions made to another retirement or superannuation scheme of which a principal is a member equal or exceed to the full minimum Kiwisaver employer or government contributions, then that principal is not eligible to receive employer or government contributions to a KiwiSaver scheme.

Part 6: Allowances

Primary Principals' Collective Agreement Effective: 17 May 2016 to 16 May 2018

6.1 Reimbursing Allowances

6.1.1 Before approving any activities which require the payment or reimbursement of expenses the employer shall ensure that such payment or reimbursement complies with any funding arrangements applying to the school.

6.1.2 Travelling Allowance

A principal required to travel within New Zealand on official business for an absence of more than one day, including attendance at approved staff development courses, educational and sports tours, shall be reimbursed for the costs of accommodation and meals on an actual and reasonable basis.

6.1.3 School Camp Allowance

A daily allowance of \$25.00 is payable to principals in charge of a class or classes attending school camp.

6.1.4 Evening Meal Allowance

In circumstances where a principal's attendance at a meeting prevents the principal concerned returning home for the normal evening meal, a meal allowance of \$11.56 is payable.

6.1.5 Expenses Incurred in Use of Private Vehicles

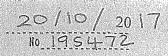
Motor vehicle altowance at a rate of 62c per km or equivalent public transport fares shall be reimbursed to principals required to use their own vehicles for official business.

6.1.6 General Expenses

Where a principal has their employer's prior approval to both the duties which will result in an expense being incurred, and the level of the expense, the employer shall on the production of receipts, reimburse actual and reasonable expenses. The expenses must have been incurred in the proper performance of the principal's

5.1.1 Employees required by their employer to use their own vehicles for school business shall be paid an allowance of \$0.58 per kilometre.

5.2 Protective clothing

5.2.1 All employees required by their employer to wear protective clothing shall be provided with appropriate garments. The garments will be laundered at the employer's expense. The clothing shall remain the property of the employer and shall be returned promptly where the employee ceases employment with the employer.

5.2.2 Where employees, in the course of their employment are expected to work in swimming pools assisting children with special needs, the employer shall meet the cost of swimwear up to a maximum of \$75.00 per year upon production of receipts.

5.3 First aid allowance

5.3.1 Where an employee (excluding a nurse aide or a nurse) holds a current first aid certificate or recognised nursing qualification and is a designated first aider in the school, such an employee shall be paid an allowance of \$0.35 per hour. The employer shall meet the cost (up to a maximum of \$160.00) of obtaining and renewing a first aid certificate from a recognised provider for a designated first aider.

5.4 Dirty work allowance

5.4.1 Where an employee is required to clean up a student soiled with vomit, excreta, urine or blood (other than blood associated with minor cuts and abrasions and minor nose bleeds) in the course of her/his duties, she/he shall be paid an allowance of \$3.85 per day or part thereof.

5.4.2 Where an employee is required to clean up a student soiled with other forms of body fluids, the allowance shall be payable at the employer's discretion.

5.4.3 This allowance shall be payable for no more than one attendance to such duties per day.

5.5 Overnight allowance

5.5.1 For any school camp or trip where an employee (other than a full time 52 week salaried

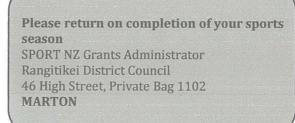

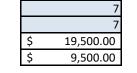

Sport NZ RURAL TRAVEL FUND

Rural Travel Fund Eligibility

- The Rural Travel Fund is designed to help subsidise travel for junior teams participating in local sport competition. The allocation of the fund is based on a population density formula for territorial authorities that have less than 10 people per square kilometre based on 45c per capita.
- Application for the Rural Travel Fund is open to rural sports clubs and rural school teams with young people aged 5-19 years who require subsidies to assist with transport expenses to local sporting competitions.

<u>Please Note</u>: The Rural Travel Fund is to be managed by the territorial authority and funding should not be provided for the purpose of travel to regional or national events.

Criteria

The following criteria shall be applied when considering applications for funding. School club teams and sport club teams are defined as:

- "a school club team participating in local sport competition in weekends, that excludes interschool and intra-school competitions played during school time"; and/or
- "A sports club team participating in organised sport competition through club membership outside of school time".
