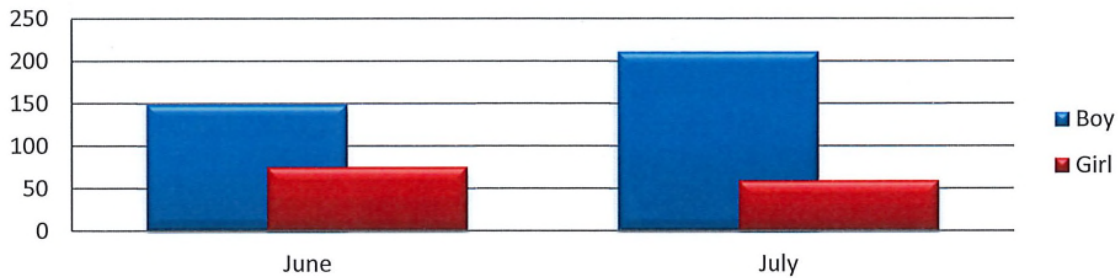

July	<p>“Matariki”</p> <p>As part of our Matariki celebrations, this year we ran a Kaumatua focussed project on Thursday 25 July. Part of the planning for the project saw our Best Practice Operations Manager liaise with Taihape Older & Bolder Group, The Taihape Friendship Group, Pukatea Wainui Kaumatua Group and the Taihape Women’s Club.</p> <p>The key outcomes we were looking to achieve for the day included celebrating Matariki, social connection for our kaumatua, encouraging mind/hand coordination, mobility, balance and sharing of kai.</p> <p>The day’s agenda started off with a Tai Chi session followed by our very own “Mokai Patea Kaumatua Olympic Games”. Kaumatua were split down into teams and played a number of challenges which included Volley Balloons, Don’t lose your marbles and Let’s go Shopping and Ready Steady Go!”</p> <p>After this was completed the group stopped for lunch and then they had a prize giving. We had a total of 27 kaumatua register for the day. We were fortunate to have assistance from Taihape Policewoman, Yvonne Sicily and also a whanau volunteer for the day. Feedback received from our kaumatua was very positive with many of them asking “When’s the next event?”</p>

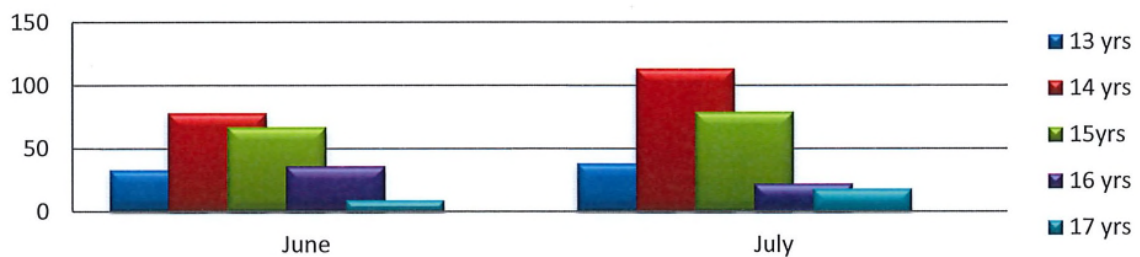

Monthly Demographic Statistics

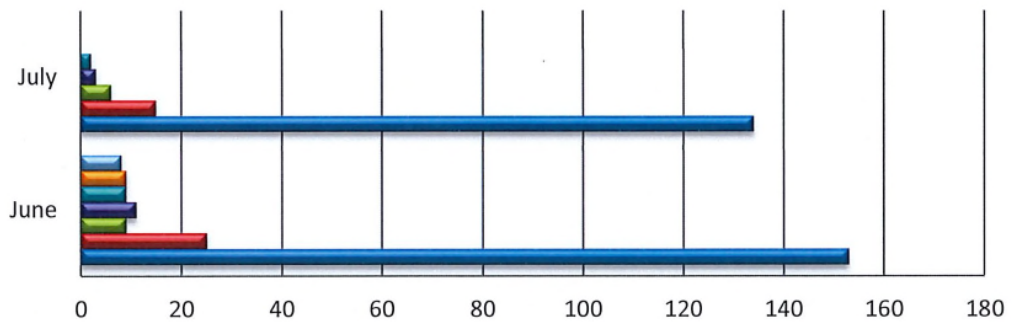
Gender

Agenda item. Signage for walkway

Description of issue to be tabled:

The Heritage Walkway linking the Outback parking with the shopping area of Taihape is nearing completion. Once completed this will be an attractive and informative facility for both local residents and visitors to our town. It is important that the walkway is well signposted for the convenience of all. The quality of visitors experience is paramount to local business.

It is envisaged that the sign on the rear wall of the Majestic Theatre is replaced and the word 'heritage' added to the wording plus a swing sign will be appropriately placed on the footpath and able to be read by all foot traffic. It will be simply worded 'Heritage Walkway'.

Resolution sought:

That the Taihape Community Board supports the upgrading of appropriate signage alerting all users of the outback parking areas to the 'Heritage Walkway'.

Outcome:

1. Additional free parking for visitors to the town.
2. An attractive convenient walkway to the town centre
3. The historical theme can be continued through future projects in this well used area giving relevancy to the signage.
4. This is a community project.

BOULDER SUPPLY AND PLACEMENT

To supply and place rocks on the grassed area at the corner of Hautapu Street and Mataroa Road adjacent to Four Square Taihape to eliminate vehicle entrance.

As requested Crimpy's has allowed to source 7 boulders at approximately 1 tonne per boulder to be supplied and delivered to Taihape at a price of \$563.50 plus GST.

Crimpy's will transport these from Byford's yard to their new location, unload them and place them strategically on the grassed area to eliminate the traffic from entering the space. This will be done with the use of barriers etc to ensure public safety during this process. Truck hire and loader hire to achieve this, and including health & safety requirements is \$636.50 plus GST. Please note the machine hire is being done at a reduced rate.

Total to undertake this above task is \$1200.00 plus GST
