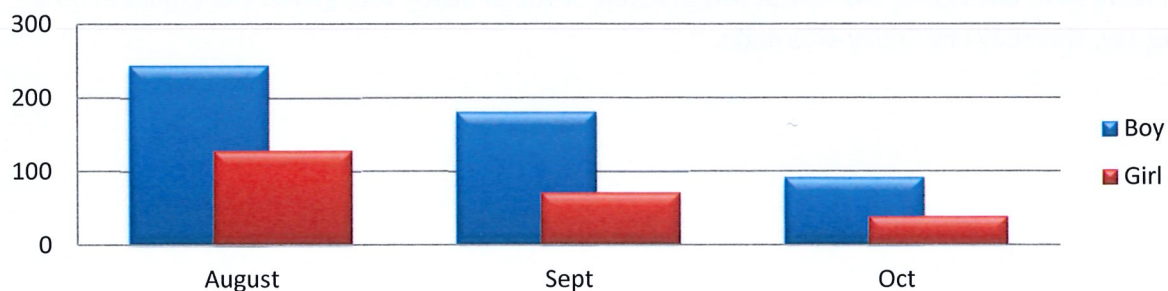
1. To provide staff or an approved person to open and be present in the Taihape Youth zone between the hours of 3-5pm during weekdays.	Appendix attached with information around this action.

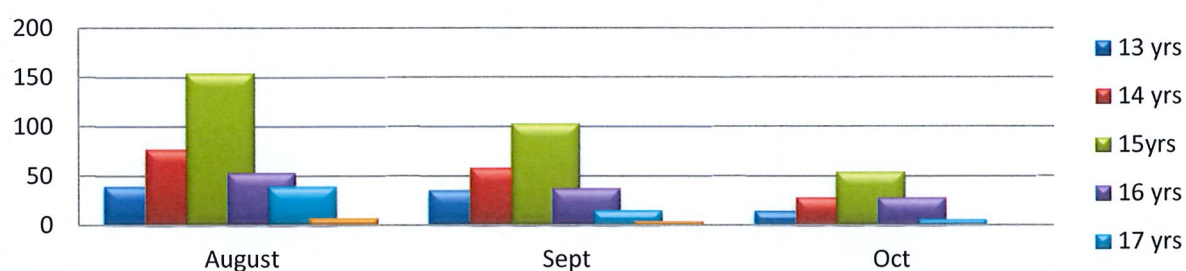

Monthly Demographic Statistics

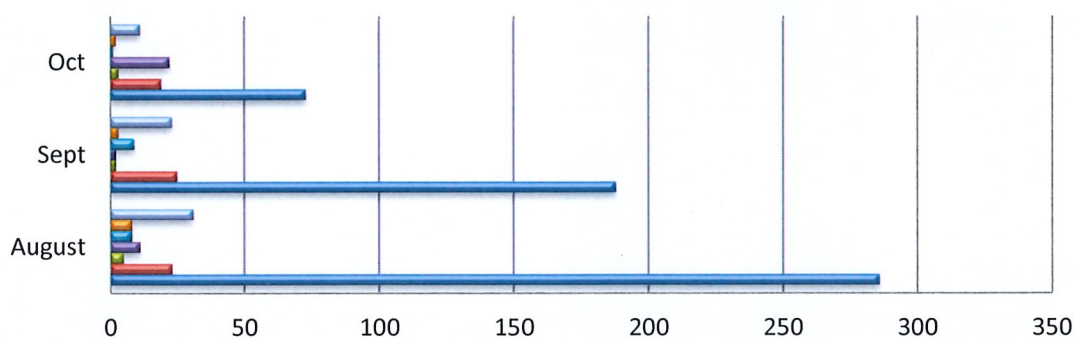
Gender

In the August **month** there was a total of 372 rangatahi who signed into The Lobby within that 22 day period. On average we had 16 rangatahi sign in on any given day.

In the September **month** there was a total of 252 rangatahi who signed into The Lobby within that 20 day period. On average we had 12 rangatahi sign in on any given day.

In the October month there was a total of 131 rangatahi who signed into The Lobby within that 19 day period. The Lobby was closed for two days as new heat pumps were being installed and through the School Holiday period on three days we had no rangatahi sign in at all. The other factor as to why numbers were low during this month was the start of Touch Rugby with games and practices on a Tuesday, Thursday and Friday afternoon.

Agenda item. Quotation from Crimpy's Contracting

Description of issue to be tabled:

The completion of the Dog Park in Robin Street has been on going for a period of time. Once completed this will provide an attractive and secure site for both the travelling public and locals to exercise their dogs. Currently many travellers allow their pets to frequent the picnic area of the Outback to the detriment of this popular area.

With this in mind TCB has sought prices for the project. The quotation currently tabled provides a full and detailed description of the construction.

Resolution sought:

That the Taihape Community Board does not accept this quotation but rather further investigates this issue with consideration to the following :

1. The conditions and tenure of the lease given the area is lease hold land
2. The area to be enclosed
3. The style of fencing to be erected including materials
4. The availability of labour/contractors

Please note there has been community input already into this project.

Outcome:

The Dog Park/Compound is fenced in a style and at a cost acceptable to TCB.

3983C - DOG COMPOUND FENCING - ROBIN STREET, TAIHAPE

As requested Crimpy's Contracting has allowed to build a fence around the area shown by Ann Abernethy to create an enclosure for the free running of dogs. There is 82m of fencing that is required. This includes a 2.4m steel gate with a strainer post to allow lawnmower access, and 2 small entry gates along Robin Street. The fence will be 900mm high as requested with 3 rails and posts in approximately 2m centres, positioned 1m back from the existing footpath, and finished with 150x25mm timber palings. All new 100x100 H4 posts will be concreted into place. We've included a traffic management plan for working on side road, and to extend an existing fence to 1.8m pails to fill in a gap next to the railway platform end of the new compound. We've allowed for cable locates as will be required.

Total to undertake this project is \$19,076.75 plus GST. Of this, all transport, logistics, machine hire, materials, traffic management, cable location and H&S requirements is \$8,906.75 plus GST; total labour is \$10,170.00 plus GST

Please note to construct this fence with timber palings instead of diamond mesh fencing is more labour intensive. A total of 10 days has been allowed to construct this fence.

Please also note we have not allowed for any painting or staining of the above fence; this is recommended to be undertaken soon after construction to maintain the integrity of the fence.

Dear Mrs Ann Abernethy,

At our recent meeting it was brought to our attention the need for a toilet facility on or near the entrance to the Mt Stewart walk at Gumboot Park. A lot of travellers who stop at the Gumboot to view &/or stretch their legs with a walk up Mt Stewart have been 'caught short' & have used the bushes as a necessity. We feel this is not only inappropriate but could over time become a health issue.

We offer these suggestions;

1. A toilet over the bridge & slightly out of sight of the general public therefore maybe only one toilet would be suffice. (Examples are toilets at Silverhope Bush Park & Queens Park in Hunterville).
2. Contacting Rustic Steak House with a joint venture with their outside toilets with open hours of 9am to 5pm (extended maybe in the summer). A sign could be installed at the bridge indicating the toilet availability.

We ask the Board to investigate the feasibility of this facility & options suggested.
