1. One Annual Event.

Planning has been underway for a while now with A&P for our next big event in Jan on the 29th 2022 along with a new name the Gumboot Country Show.

Ann and I attended a meeting with the Royal Agricultural Society (RAS) in Taihape to discuss a change of month from Jan to Feb/Mar for 2023. Sounds promising a work in progress.

2. Community Newsletters & social media.

Taihape Community Development Trust continue maintaining and delivering on the newsletter to the community. The Talk Up Taihape Newsletter total numbers have fluctuated over the last few months from 1240-1250. These numbers include town businesses, homes and Mangaweka 700-705, RDI - 180, RD2 & 3-200, RD4 & 5-150, Information centre - 15.

Relationships with the Economic Development Team for Social Housing and District Promotions continues and important to keep council connected with the community.

5. Christmas Parade and Taihape Christmas Luncheon.

6. Spring Fling Shop Window Display.
