# 10 Application to graze a portion of the Turakina Cemetery

The Committee discussed that while supportive of the proposal for a lease of this part of the Turakina Cemetery, that it is essential the animals are contained in a stock proof fence so the animals cannot escape. These concerns are based on historical issues, where stock grazing of the Turakina Cemetery resulted in damage. It is suggested that a clause is written into the lease to enable the lease to be terminated if stock are able to escape, and that any damage which occurs as a result of the stock escaping is funded by the lease.

The Turakina Community Committee recommends that the request be accepted to fence and graze a portion of the Turakina Cemetery, provided a fully stock proof fence is provided, and that the Rangitikei District Council create a lease agreement with Mr and Mrs Doughty on this basis for an initial five year period.

#### 1 Allocation

1.1 The amount of the 2017-2018 Small Projects Grant Scheme for Turakina Ward is \$710.

- 1.2 The allocation of the Small Projects Grant Scheme is for the period 1 July to 30 June each year. At its meeting on 29 February 2016, Council resolved to allow carry-forward from one financial year to the next of up to 100% of the annual allocation for any Committee's Small Projects Grant Fund, with the proviso that this be a specific resolution of the Committee.
- 1.3 At its last meeting for the 2016-2017 year the Committee resolved to carry-over the balance of the Scheme; the remaining balance was \$260.00. This gives a total allocation for the 2017-2018 year of \$970.
